### AN ACT

To amend chapter 160, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to a task force to study teacher compensation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 160, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 160.256, to read as follows:

- 160.256. 1. During the legislative interim between the first and second regular sessions of the ninety-sixth general assembly, the joint committee on education shall oversee a task force on teacher compensation and effectiveness.
- 5 2. The membership of the task force shall consist of the 6
- following:
- 7 (1) Two members of the senate who serve on the joint committee
- on education, one to be appointed by the president pro tem of the
- senate and one to be appointed by the minority leader of the senate and
- 10 two members of the house of representatives who serve on the joint
- 11 committee on education, one to be appointed by the speaker of the
- house of representatives and one to be appointed by the minority 12
- leader of the house of representatives; 13
- (2) The commissioner of education or his or her designee; 14
- (3) Three members who shall be active teachers, to be appointed 15
- by the president pro tem of the senate;

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- 17 (4) One member who shall be an active public school
- 18 administrator, to be appointed by the president pro tem of the senate;
- 19 (5) One member who shall be an active school board member, to
- 20 be appointed by the president pro tem of the senate;
- 21 (6) The dean or chief administrator of a state-approved
- 22 baccalaureate-level teacher preparation program located in Missouri,
- 23 to be appointed by the president pro tem of the senate;
- 24 (7) One member who shall be an academic researcher from
- 25 Missouri or a contiguous state with expertise in education policy, to be
- 26 appointed by the president pro tem of the senate;
- 27 (8) The executive director of the public school retirement system
- 28 of Missouri, or his or her designee, who shall have a background or
- 29 employment experience with a public school retirement system in
- 30 Missouri; and
- 31 (9) An expert in human resources or personnel policies from the
- 32 private sector with experience evaluating employee performance, to be
- 33 appointed by the president pro tem of the senate.
- 3. The task force shall consider options and make
- 35 recommendations to the general assembly and state board of education
- 36 that seek to ensure that all licensed education personnel are:
- 37 (1) Evaluated using multiple fair, transparent, timely, rigorous,
- 38 and valid methods, which shall consider and include the academic
- 39 growth of their students;
- 40 (2) Afforded a meaningful opportunity to improve their
- 41 effectiveness;
- 42 (3) Provided the means to share effective practices with other
- 43 educators throughout the state.
- 44 4. The task force shall meet at least four times. Meetings may be
- 45 conducted by video conference or teleconference.
- 46 5. A chair and vice chair of the task force shall be selected by the
- 47 task force.
- 48 6. The task force shall submit a final report with
- 49 recommendations for legislative action by the general assembly no later
- 50 than December 31, 2011, to the chair of the joint committee on
- 51 education, the secretary of the senate, the chief clerk of the house of
- 52 representatives, and the president of the state board of education.
- 7. Task force members shall receive no compensation for their

- duties. Actual and necessary expenses of the task force and its members shall be paid by the joint committee on education.
- 8. The staff of the joint committee on education, committee on legislative research, senate research, and house research shall provide such legal, research, clerical, technical, and bill drafting services as the

59 task force may require in performance of its duties.

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
