To amend chapter 506, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the laws of other countries.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 506, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 506.530, to read as follows:

506.530. 1. A contract or contractual provision, if capable of $\mathbf{2}$ segregation, which provides for the choice of a foreign law to govern some or all of the disputes between the parties adjudicated by a court 3 4 of law or by an arbitration panel arising from the contract mutually agreed upon shall violate the public policy of this state and be void and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 unenforceable if the foreign law chosen includes or incorporates any 7 substantive or procedural law, as applied to the dispute at issue, that 8 would not grant to the parties the same fundamental liberties, rights, and privileges granted to the parties under the United States and 9 **Missouri Constitutions.** 10

11 2. (1) A contract or contractual provision, if capable of segregation, which provides for jurisdiction for purposes of granting 1213the courts or arbitration panels in personam jurisdiction over the 14parties to adjudicate any disputes between parties arising from the 15contract mutually agreed upon shall violate the public policy of this 16 state and be void and unenforceable if the jurisdiction chosen includes 17any foreign law, as applied to the dispute at issue, that would not grant to the parties the same fundamental liberties, rights, and privileges 18granted to the parties under the United States and Missouri 19Constitutions. 20

21(2) If a resident of this state, subject to personal jurisdiction in this state, seeks to maintain litigation, arbitration, agency, or similarly 2223binding proceedings in this state and if the courts of this state find that 24granting a claim of forum non conveniens or a related claim violates or would likely violate the fundamental liberties, rights, and privileges 2526granted under the United States and Missouri Constitutions of the nonclaimant in the foreign forum with respect to the matter in dispute, 27then it is the public policy of this state that the claim shall be denied. 28293. As used in this section, "foreign law" means any law of a jurisdiction outside of any state or territory of the United States, 30 including but not limited to, international organizations and tribunals, 31and applied by that jurisdiction's courts, administrative bodies, or 32other formal or informal tribunals. 33
