AN ACT

To amend chapter 334, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to interventional pain management.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 334, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 334.153, to read as follows:

334.153. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

- 3 (1) "Chronic pain", a pain state which is subacute, persistent, and 4 intractable:
- 5 (2) "Interventional pain management", the diagnosis and 6 treatment of chronic pain through the use of such techniques as:
- 7 (a) Ablation of targeted nerves;
- 8 (b) Percutaneous precision needle placement within the spinal
 9 column with placement of drugs, such as local anesthetics, steroids, and
 10 analgesics, in targeted areas of the spinal column; or
- 11 (c) Surgical techniques, such as laser or endoscopic discectomy, 12 intrathecal infusion pumps, and spinal cord stimulators.
- 2. No person shall practice or offer to practice interventional pain management in this state unless such person is a physician licensed under this chapter.
- 3. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a certified registered nurse anesthetist as defined in chapter 335 from providing anesthesia services pursuant to subsection 7 of section 334.104.
 - 4. The state board of registration for the healing arts may

21promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule 22or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is 23created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions 24of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and 25chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 26 general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to delay the 27effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 28unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule 2930 proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void.
