### AN ACT

To repeal sections 337.300, 337.305, 337.310, 337.315, 337.325, and 337.345, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof six new sections relating to behavior analysis.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 337.300, 337.305, 337.310, 337.315, 337.325, and

- 2 337.345, RSMo, are repealed and six new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be
- 3 known as sections 337.300, 337.305, 337.310, 337.315, 337.325, and 337.347, to
- 4 read as follows:

337.300. As used in sections 337.300 to 337.345, the following terms shall

- 2 mean:
- 3 (1) "Applied behavior analysis", the design, implementation, and
- 4 evaluation of environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and
- 5 consequences, to produce socially significant improvement in human behavior,
- 6 including the use of direct observation, measurement, and functional analysis of
- 7 the relationships between environment and behavior. Applied behavior
- 8 analysis does not include cognitive therapies or psychological testing,
- 9 personality assessment, intellectual assessment, neuropsychological
- 10 assessment, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy,
- 11 psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, family therapy, and long-term
- 12 counseling as treatment modalities;
- 13 (2) "Board", the behavior analyst advisory board within the state
- 14 committee of psychologists;
- 15 (3) "Certifying entity", the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst
- 16 Certification Board, or other equivalent nationally accredited nongovernmental

17 agency approved by the committee which certifies individuals who have completed

- 18 academic, examination, training, and supervision requirements in applied
- 19 behavior analysis;
- 20 (4) "Committee", the state committee of psychologists;
- 21 (5) "Division", the division of professional registration within the 22 department of insurance, financial institutions and professional registration;
- 23 (6) "Licensed assistant behavior analyst" or "LaBA", an individual who is 24 certified by the certifying entity as a certified assistant behavior analyst and 25 meets the criteria in section 337.315 and as established by committee rule;
- 26 (7) "Licensed behavior analyst" or "LBA", an individual who is certified 27 by the certifying entity as a certified behavior analyst and meets the criteria in 28 section 337.315 and as established by committee rule;
- 29 (8) "Practice of applied behavior analysis", the application of the 30 principles, methods, and procedures of the experimental analysis of behavior and 31 applied behavior analysis (including principles of operant and respondent 32 learning) to assess and improve socially important human behaviors. It includes, 33 but is not limited to, applications of those principles, methods, and procedures to:
- 34 (a) The design, implementation, evaluation, and modification of treatment 35 programs to change behavior of individuals;
- 36 (b) The design, implementation, evaluation, and modification of treatment 37 programs to change behavior of groups; and
- 38 (c) Consultation to individuals and organizations[. Applied behavior 39 analysis does not include cognitive therapies or psychological testing, personality 40 assessment, intellectual assessment, neuropsychological assessment, 41 psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, 42 family therapy, and long-term counseling as treatment modalities];
- 43 (9) "Provisionally licensed assistant behavior analyst" or 44 "PLABA", an individual who meets the criteria in subsection 5 of section 45 337.315 and as established by the committee by rule;
- 46 (10) "Provisionally licensed behavior analyst" or "PLBA", an 47 individual who meets the criteria in subsection 5 of section 337.315 and 48 as established by the committee by rule;
- 49 (11) "Temporary licensed assistant behavior analyst" or "TLaBA", 50 an individual who meets the criteria of subsection 4 of section 337.315 51 and as established by the committee by rule;
- 52 (12) "Temporary licensed behavior analyst" or "TLBA", an

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individual who meets the criteria in subsection 4 of section 337.315 and
 as established by the committee by rule.

337.305. 1. There is hereby created under the state committee of psychologists within the division of professional registration the "Behavior Analyst Advisory Board". The behavior analyst advisory board shall consist of the following seven members: three licensed behavior analysts, one licensed behavior analyst holding a doctoral degree, one licensed assistant behavior analyst, one professional member of the committee, and one public member.

- 2. Appointments to the board, except for the one professional member of the committee, shall be made by the governor upon the recommendations of the director of the division, upon the advice and consent of the senate. The division, prior to submitting nominations, shall solicit nominees from professional associations and licensed behavior analysts or licensed assistant behavior analysts in the state. Appointment to the board of the one professional member of the committee shall be made by nomination and majority vote of the committee.
- 15 3. The term of office for board members shall be five years. In making initial appointments to the board, the governor shall stagger the terms of the 16 17 appointees so that one member serves an initial term of two years, three members shall serve an initial term of three years, and three members serve initial terms 18 19 of four years. Each member of the board shall hold office until his or her 20 successor has been qualified. A vacancy in the membership of the board shall be filled for the unexpired term in the manner provided for the original appointment. 2122A member appointed for less than a full term may serve two full terms in 23 addition to such part of a full term.
  - 4. Each board member shall be a resident of this state for a period of one year and a registered voter, shall be a United States citizen, and shall, other than the public member, have been a licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior analyst in this state for at least three years prior to appointment except for the original members of the board who shall have experience in the practice of applied behavior analysis.
  - 5. The public member shall be a person who is not and never was a member of any profession licensed or regulated under sections 337.300 to 337.345 or the spouse of such person; and a person who does not have and never has had a material financial interest in either the providing of the professional services regulated by sections 337.300 to 337.345, or an activity or organization directly

- 35 related to any profession licensed or regulated under sections 337.300 to 337.345.
- 36 6. The board shall meet at least quarterly. At one of its regular meetings,
- 37 the board shall select from among its members a chairperson and a vice
- 38 chairperson. A quorum of the committee shall consist of a majority of its
- 39 members. In the absence of the chairperson, the vice chairperson shall conduct
- 40 the office of the chairperson.
- 41 7. Each member of the board shall receive as compensation an amount set
- 42 by the division not to exceed fifty dollars for each day devoted to the affairs of the
- 43 board and shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary and actual expenses
- 44 incurred in the performance of the member's official duties.
- 8. Staff for the board shall be provided by the director of the division of
- 46 professional registration.
- 9. The governor may remove any member of the board for misconduct,
- 48 inefficiency, incompetency, or neglect of office. All vacancies shall be filled by
- 49 appointment of the governor with the advice and consent of the senate, and the
- 50 member so appointed shall serve for the unexpired term.
  - 337.310. 1. The behavior analyst advisory board is authorized to:
- 2 (1) Review all applications for licensure, provisional licensure, and
- 3 temporary licensure for behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts and
- 4 any supporting documentation submitted with the application to the committee
- 5 and make recommendations to the committee regarding the resolution of the
- 6 application;
- 7 (2) Review all complaints made relating to the practice of behavior
- 8 analysis and make recommendations to the committee regarding investigation of
- 9 the complaint, referral for discipline or other resolution of the complaint; and
- 10 (3) Review any entities responsible for certifying behavior analysts and
- 11 make recommendations to the committee as to approval or disapproval of the
- 12 certifying entity based on qualifications established by the committee.
- 13 2. The board shall recommend to the committee rules to be promulgated
- 14 pertaining to:
- 15 (1) The form and content of license applications required and the
- 16 procedures for filing an application for an initial, provisional temporary or
- 17 renewal license in this state;
- 18 (2) The establishment of fees;
- 19 (3) The educational and training requirements for licensed behavior
- 20 analysts and licensed assistant behavior analysts;

- 21 (4) The roles, responsibilities, and duties of licensed behavior analysts [and], licensed assistant behavior analysts, provisionally licensed behavior analysts, provisionally licensed assistant behavior analysts, temporary licensed behavior analysts, and temporary licensed assistant behavior analysts;
- 26 (5) The characteristics of supervision and supervised clinical practicum 27 experience for [the] licensed behavior analyst [and the], licensed assistant 28 behavior analyst, provisionally licensed behavior analysts, provisionally 29 licensed assistant behavior analysts, temporary licensed behavior 30 analysts, and temporary licensed assistant behavior analysts;
  - (6) The supervision of licensed assistant behavior analysts, provisionally licensed behavior analysts, provisionally licensed assistant behavior analysts, temporary licensed behavior analysts, and temporary licensed assistant behavior analysts;
- 35 (7) The requirements for continuing education for licensed behavior 36 analysts and licensed assistant behavior analysts;
  - (8) A code of conduct; and

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- 38 (9) Any other policies or procedures necessary to the fulfillment of the 39 requirements of sections 337.300 to 337.345.
- 3. Only after the board's recommendation and approval by majority vote may the committee make any final decisions related to licensing, rules and regulations, complaint resolution, approval of certifying entities or any actions bearing upon the practice of applied behavior analysis unless otherwise authorized by sections 337.300 to 337.345.
  - 4. [Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 3 of this section, until such time as the governor appoints the board and the board has a quorum, the committee shall review and resolve all applications for licensure as a licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior analyst.
- 5.] Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 49 50 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of 51 52chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant 53 54to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul 55a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2010, shall be 56

invalid and void.

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337.315. 1. An applied behavior analysis intervention shall produce socially significant improvements in human behavior through skill acquisition, increase or decrease in behaviors under specific environmental conditions and the reduction of problematic behavior. An applied behavior analysis intervention shall:

- 6 (1) Be based on empirical research and the identification of functional relations between behavior and environment, contextual factors, antecedent stimuli and reinforcement operations through the direct observation and measurement of behavior, arrangement of events and observation of effects on behavior, as well as other information gathering methods such as record review and interviews; and
- 12 (2) Utilize changes and arrangements of contextual factors, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and other consequences to produce behavior 13 14 change.
- 2. Each person wishing to practice as a licensed behavior analyst shall: 15
- 16 (1) Submit a complete application on a form approved by the committee;
- (2) Pay all necessary fees as set by the committee; 17
- (3) Submit a two-inch or three-inch photograph or passport photograph 18 19 taken no more than six months prior to the application date;
- 20 (4) Provide two classified sets of fingerprints for processing by the Missouri state highway patrol under section 43.543. One set of fingerprints shall 2122be used by the highway patrol to search the criminal history repository and the second set shall be forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for searching 23 the federal criminal history files; 24
- 25 (5) Have passed an examination and been certified as a board-certified behavior analyst by a certifying entity, as defined in section 337.300; 26
- 27(6) Provide evidence of active status as a board-certified behavior analyst; 28 and
- 29 (7) If the applicant holds a license as a behavior analyst in another state, 30 a statement from all issuing states verifying licensure and identifying any 31 disciplinary action taken against the license holder by that state.
- 32 3. Each person wishing to practice as a licensed assistant behavior 33 analyst shall:
- 34 (1) Submit a complete application on a form approved by the committee;
- (2) Pay all necessary fees as set by the committee; 35

- 36 (3) Submit a two-inch or three-inch photograph or passport photograph 37 taken no more than six months prior to the application date;
- 38 (4) Provide two classified sets of fingerprints for processing by the 39 Missouri state highway patrol under section 43.543. One set of fingerprints shall 40 be used by the highway patrol to search the criminal history repository and the 41 second set shall be forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for searching 42 the federal criminal history files;
  - (5) Have passed an examination and been certified as a board-certified assistant behavior analyst by a certifying entity, as defined in section 337.300;
- 45 (6) Provide evidence of active status as a board-certified assistant 46 behavior analyst;
- 47 (7) If the applicant holds a license as an assistant behavior analyst in 48 another state, a statement from all issuing states verifying licensure and 49 identifying any disciplinary action taken against the license holder by that state; 50 and
  - (8) Submit documentation satisfactory to the committee that the applicant will be directly supervised by a licensed behavior analyst in a manner consistent with the certifying entity.
  - 4. The committee shall be authorized to issue a temporary license to an applicant for a behavior analyst license or assistant behavior analyst license upon receipt of a complete application, submission of a fee as set by the committee by rule for behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst [or], and a showing of valid licensure as a behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst in another state, only if the applicant has submitted fingerprints and no disqualifying criminal history appears on the family care safety registry. The temporary license shall expire upon issuance of a license or denial of the application but no later than ninety days from issuance of the temporary license. Upon written request to the committee, the holder of a temporary license shall be entitled to one extension of ninety days of the temporary license.
  - 5. (1) The committee shall, in accordance with rules promulgated by the committee, issue a provisional behavior analyst license or a provisional assistant behavior analyst license upon receipt by the committee of a complete application, appropriate fee as set by the committee by rule, and proof of satisfaction of requirements under subsections 2 and 3 of this section, respectively, and other requirements established by the committee by rule, except that

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- applicants for a provisional license as either a behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst need not have passed an examination and been certified as a board certified behavior analyst or a board certified assistant behavior analyst to obtain a provisional behavior analyst or provisional assistant behavior analyst license.
  - (2) A provisional license issued under this subsection shall only authorize and permit the licensee to render behavior analysis under the supervision and the full professional responsibility and control of such licensee's licensed supervisor.
  - (3) A provisional license shall automatically terminate upon issuance of a permanent license, upon a finding of cause to discipline after notice and hearing under section 337.330, upon termination of supervision by a licensed supervisor, or upon the expiration of one year from the date of issuance of the provisional license, whichever first occurs. The provisional license may be renewed after one year, with a maximum issuance of two years. Upon a showing of good cause, the committee by rule shall provide procedures for exceptions and variances from the requirement of a maximum issuance of two years.
- 6. No person shall hold himself or herself out to be licensed behavior analysts or LBA, provisionally licensed behavior analyst or PLBA, provisionally licensed assistant behavior analyst or PLABA, temporary licensed behavior analyst or TLBA, or temporary licensed assistant behavior analyst or TLBA, licensed assistant behavior analysts or LaBA in the state of Missouri unless they meet the applicable requirements.
- 96 [6.] 7. No persons shall practice applied behavior analysis unless they 97 are:
- 98 (1) Licensed behavior analysts;
- 99 (2) Licensed assistant behavior analysts working under the supervision 100 of a licensed behavior analyst;
- 101 (3) An individual who has a bachelor's or graduate degree and completed 102 course work for licensure as a behavior analyst and is obtaining supervised field 103 experience under a licensed behavior analyst pursuant to required supervised 104 work experience for licensure at the behavior analyst or assistant behavior 105 analyst level; [or]
- 106 (4) Licensed psychologists practicing within the rules and standards of 107 practice for psychologists in the state of Missouri and whose practice is

108 commensurate with their level of training and experience;

- 109 (5) Provisionally licensed behavior analysts;
- 110 (6) Provisionally licensed assistant behavior analysts;
- 111 (7) Temporary licensed behavior analysts; or
- 112 (8) Temporary licensed assistant behavior analysts.
- [7.] 8. Notwithstanding the provisions in subsection 6 of this section, any licensed or certified professional may practice components of applied behavior analysis, as defined in section 337.300 if he or she is acting within his or her
- 116 applicable scope of practice and ethical guidelines.
- 117 [8.] 9. All licensed behavior analysts and licensed assistant behavior 118 analysts shall be bound by the code of conduct adopted by the committee by rule.
- 119 [9.] 10. Licensed assistant behavior analysts shall work under the direct 120 supervision of a licensed behavior analyst as established by committee rule.
- 121 [10.] 11. Persons who provide services under the Individuals with
- 122 Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 U.S.C. Section 1400, et seq., or Section 504
- 123 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. Section 794, or are enrolled
- 124 in a course of study at a recognized educational institution through which the
- 125 person provides applied behavior analysis as part of supervised clinical
- 126 experience shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.
- 127 [11.] 12. A violation of this section shall be punishable by probation,
- 128 suspension, or loss of any license held by the violator.
  - 337.325. A licensed behavior analyst [and], licensed assistant behavior
  - 2 analyst, provisionally licensed behavior analyst, provisionally licensed
  - 3 assistant behavior analyst, temporary licensed behavior analyst and
  - 4 temporary licensed assistant behavior analyst shall limit his or her
  - 5 practice to demonstrated areas of competence as documented by relevant
  - 6 professional education, training, or experience. A licensed behavior analyst
  - 7 [and], licensed assistant behavior analyst, provisionally licensed behavior
  - 8 analyst, provisionally licensed assistant behavior analyst, temporary
  - 9 licensed behavior analyst and temporary licensed assistant behavior
  - 10 analyst trained in one area shall not practice in another area without obtaining
  - 11 additional relevant professional education, training, and experience.
    - 337.347. For reimbursement and billing purposes of section
    - 2 376.1224, a provisionally licensed assistant behavior analyst, a
    - 3 provisionally licensed behavior analyst, or a temporary licensed
    - 4 behavior analyst shall each be considered an assistant board-certified

#### 5 behavior analyst.

[337.345. 1. Prior to August 28, 2012, each person desiring to obtain a provisional license shall make application to the committee upon such forms and in such manner as may be prescribed by the committee and shall pay the required application fee. The application fee shall not be refundable. Each application shall contain a statement that it is made under oath or affirmation and that its representations are true and correct to the best knowledge and belief of the person signing the application, subject to the penalties of making a false affidavit or declaration.

- 2. For a provisional behavior analyst license, the applicant shall:
- (1) Submit a two-inch or three-inch photograph or passport photograph taken no more than six months prior to the application date, and only if the applicant has submitted fingerprints and no disqualifying criminal history appears on the family care safety registry;
- (2) Have passed an examination and been certified as a board-certified behavior analyst by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board or a certifying entity listed in subdivision (3) of section 337.300; and
- (3) Provide evidence of active status as a board-certified behavior analyst.
- 3. For a provisional assistant behavior analyst license, the applicant shall:
- (1) Submit a two-inch or three-inch photograph or passport photograph taken no more than six months prior to the application date, and only if the applicant has submitted fingerprints and no disqualifying criminal history appears on the family care safety registry;
- (2) Have passed an examination and been certified as a board-certified assistant behavior analyst by a certifying entity listed in subdivision (3) of section 337.300;
- (3) Provide evidence of active status as a board-certified assistant behavior analyst; and
  - (4) Submit documentation satisfactory to the board that the

37	in a manner consistent with the certifying entity.
38	4. Each applicant for provisional licensure shall meet the
39	applicable requirements of section 337.315 within three months of
40	the date of issuance of the provisional license.
41	5. The provisional license shall be effective only until the
42	later to occur of:
43	(1) Grant or rejection of a license pursuant to section
44	337.315; or
45	(2) August 28, 2012. The holder of a provisional license
46	which has not expired, been suspended, or revoked shall be deemed
47	to be the holder of a license issued under section 337.315 until such
48	provisional license expires, is suspended, or revoked.]

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
