AN ACT

To repeal section 67.2010, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to county ordinance violations in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 67.2010, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 67.2010, to read as follows:

eighty-two thousand but less than eighty-two thousand one hundred inhabitants

and any county of the first classification with more than two hundred

sixty thousand but fewer than three hundred thousand inhabitants may

elect to have the violations of county ordinances adopted pursuant to [section

304.130] the authority provided by statute heard and determined by an

associate circuit judge of the circuit in which the county is located; provided,

however, if such election is made, all violations of that county's ordinances

adopted pursuant to [section 304.130] statutory authority shall be heard and

determined before an associate circuit judge or judges. Nothing in this subsection

shall preclude the transfer or assignment of another judge to hear and determine

2. If a county elects to have the violations of its county ordinances [adopted pursuant to section 304.130] heard and determined by an associate circuit judge, the associate circuit judge or judges shall commence hearing and determining such violations six months after the county notifies the presiding
