AN ACT

To authorize the conveyance of property owned by the state in Pettis County to the City of Sedalia.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. 1. The governor is hereby authorized and empowered $\mathbf{2}$ to sell, transfer, grant, and convey a permanent easement over, on, and 3 under property owned by the state in Pettis County to the City of Sedalia. The property is more particularly described as follows: 4 COMMENCING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE 56 SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 5, TOWNSHIP 45 NORTH, RANGE 21 WEST OF THE FIFTH PRINCIPAL 7 MERIDIAN, PETTIS COUNTY, MISSOURI; THENCE N 8 86°29'52" W ALONG THE SOUTH LINE OF SAID 9 SOUTHWEST QUARTER, 939 FEET TO THE POINT OF 10 **BEGINNING OF THE PARCEL CONVEYED TO THE STATE** 11 OF MISSOURI IN VOLUME 289 AT PAGE 242 IN THE 12PETTIS COUNTY RECORDERS OFFICE, AND AS SHOWN 13ON A SURVEY IN PLAT CABINET B AT PAGE 775 TO THE 14POINT BEGINNING; THENCE CONTINUING N 86°29'52"W 15ALONG SAID SOUTH LINE, 323 FEET TO THE EASTERLY 16**RIGHT OF WAY OF THE MISSOURI PACIFIC RAILROAD** 17COMPANY DESCRIBED IN VOLUME 140 AT PAGE 298, 18 AND AS SHOWN ON SAID SURVEY IN PLAT CABINET B 19 AT PAGE 775; THENCE N 2°24'46"E ALONG SAID RIGHT 20OF WAY, 387.32 FEET; THENCE S 87°36'42"E, 323 FEET TO 2122THE EAAST LINE OF SAID VOLUME 289 AT PAGE 242; THENCE S 2°24'41"W ALONG SAID EAST LINE, 393.60 23

24FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING, CONTAINING 2.925ACRES, MORE OR LESS, RESERVING TO THE STATE OF26MISSOURI INGRESS AND EGRESS TO THE NORTH 2.127ACRES MORE OR LESS OF THE PARCEL DESCRIBED IN28VOLUME 289 AT PAGE 242.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM THE RIGHT OF WAY FOR
HIGHWAY Y AS SHOWN ON SAID SURVEY IN PLAT
CABINET B AT PAGE 775, AND THE MISSOURI
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PLANS FOR STATE
HIGHWAY Y.

2. The commissioner of administration shall set the terms and conditions for the conveyance as the commissioner deems reasonable. Such terms and conditions may include, but are not limited to, the number of appraisals required, the time, place, and terms of the conveyance.
