AN ACT

To amend chapter 537, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to civil liability immunity for court appointed attorneys, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 537, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 537.865, to read as follows:

537.865. An attorney appointed by the court to serve as counsel

for an indigent party shall be immune from civil liability, including

causes of action for malpractice, for discretionary acts or omissions

committed during the course of the representation so long as the

actions or omissions are taken in good faith and are not performed

with reckless disregard. Immunity from civil liability shall not apply

to conduct that is willfully wrong or performed with malice or

corruption.

Section B. Because of the growing need for court appointed attorneys to represent indigent parties pro bono publico, section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
