AN ACT

To amend chapter 376, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 376, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 376.1188, to read as follows:

376.1188. 1. The department of insurance, financial institutions and professional registration, nor any other department, agency, or instrumentality of this state shall apply for, accept, or expend federal grants or moneys relating to the implementation of the federal health care act unless such acceptance or expenditure is authorized by statute or an appropriations bill.

7 2. Any taxpayer of this state or any member of the general assembly shall have standing to bring suit against the state of Missouri 8 9 or any official, department, division, or agency of this state which is in violation of this section in any court with jurisdiction to enforce the 10 provisions of this section. The court shall award attorney's fees, court 11 12 costs, and all reasonable expenses incurred by the taxpayer or member 13of the general assembly if the court finds that the provisions of this 14 section have been violated. Such attorney's fees, court costs, and reasonable expenses shall be paid from funds appropriated to the 1516 department, division, or agency of this state determined to have violated, in whole or in part, the provisions of this section. In no case 17 18 shall the award of attorney's fees, court costs, or reasonable expenses 19 be paid from the legal defense fund, nor shall any department, division, 20agency, or political subdivision of this state request, or be granted, 21additional appropriations in order to satisfy an award made under this

22 section.

3. As used in this section, the term "federal health care act" shall
mean the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Public
Law 111-148, as amended by the federal Health Care and Education
Reconciliation Act of 2010, Public Law 111-152, and any amendments
thereto, or regulations or guidance issued under such federal acts.
