AN ACT

To repeal section 168.400, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to professional development programs for public schools.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 168.400, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 168.400, to read as follows:

168.400. 1. Sections 168.400 to 168.415 shall be known and may be cited 2 as the "Missouri Professional Teacher and Administrator Act". This section shall 3 become effective September 1, 1988, and shall establish programs for the 4 following public school personnel:

- (1) The preservice teacher or student in training;
- 6 (2) The beginning teacher;
- 7 (3) The practicing teacher; and

8 (4) The administrator.

9 2. Preservice teacher programs established under this section shall 10 include, but need not be limited to, the following provisions:

11 (1) A program of entry-level testing of all prospective teacher education students shall be established at all colleges and universities offering approved 12teacher education programs and, with the advice of the advisory council as 13 provided in section 168.015, shall be administered by the commissioner of 14 15education, who shall cause the department of elementary and secondary education to develop or select such tests to establish abilities necessary to receive 16 a satisfactory rating, and to establish procedures for the administering of the test; 1718 (2) The entry-level tests developed under this subsection shall include, but need not be limited to, an examination of basic oral and written communication 19

20 skills and of basic mathematics skills, and may include both oral and written

21 examinations;

(3) Each prospective teacher education student shall be required to obtain
a satisfactory rating prior to admission into the approved teacher education
program;

25(4) The department of elementary and secondary education, with the 26advice of the advisory council as provided in section 168.015, shall establish and 27monitor exit requirements from approved teacher education programs which shall 28be met by all preservice teacher education students seeking certification in 29Missouri, and specific criteria for a preservice teacher assessment that all candidates for certification shall meet. The preservice teacher assessment 30 31established under this subdivision shall include, but need not be limited to, 32classroom achievement, practice teaching evaluation and observation, successful 33 participation in assessment centers, interviews, tests and other evaluation measures. The department of elementary and secondary education shall 3435promulgate rules to allow all preservice teacher education students who have been employed for at least two years as teacher assistants to utilize their teacher 36 37 assistant experience to bypass the practice teaching evaluation and observation 38 process. These rules shall allow the certified teacher working with the teacher 39 assistant to observe and evaluate the teacher assistant's practice teaching. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the authority of this section 4041 shall become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to chapter 536. The preservice teacher assessment shall be reviewed by the certifying 4243authority prior to issuance of a certificate. An unsatisfactory assessment shall result in the nonissuance of a certificate. Persons who are aggrieved by the 4445nonissuance of a certificate may appeal such nonissuance in the manner provided in section 168.071. Any costs associated with the entry-level tests or the exit 46requirements established under this subsection shall be borne by each institution 47and costs defrayal included in the incidental fees charged to the student. 48

49 3. Each approved teacher education program shall require the faculty 50 teaching preservice teacher education courses to further their professional 51 development through direct personal involvement in the public schools in grades 52 kindergarten through twelve on a periodic basis. As used in this subsection, the 53 term "faculty" shall include, but need not be limited to, full- and part-time 54 classroom instructors, and supervisors of practice teaching at institutions offering 55 an approved teacher education program.

4. Beginning teacher assistance programs established under this section

57 shall include, but need not be limited to, the following provisions:

58(1) Such programs shall require each school district to provide a plan of professional development for the first two years of teaching for any teacher who 5960 does not have prior teaching experience. The professional development plan shall include assistance from a professional development committee, which is hereby 61 62 established in each school district, which committee shall work with beginning 63 teachers and experienced teachers in identifying instructional concerns and remedies; serve as a confidential consultant upon a teacher's request; assess 64 faculty needs and develop in-service opportunities for school staff; and present to 65 66 the proper authority faculty suggestions, ideas and recommendations pertaining to classroom instruction within the school district. The members of each 67 68 professional development committee shall be selected by the teachers employed 69 by the school district in question. The professional development plan may include guidance from a district-designated faculty member employed at a grade level 7071comparable to the instructional grade level of the beginning teacher, and such 72other forms of assistance which the school district may choose to offer. The 73professional development committee may apply to the state board of education for 74a grant, which shall be in addition to any state aid provided to the committee for activities identified in this subdivision. The grant thus awarded shall be used by 75the committee to provide in-service training to the teachers of the district on 7677teaching children identified as at risk of failing in school as defined in section 167.273. The department of elementary and secondary education shall provide 7879 resource materials and assist the committee if such assistance is requested;

80 (2) Such programs shall include assistance from the teacher education
81 program which provided the teacher's training if such training was provided in
82 a Missouri college or university. Such assistance from the college or university
83 may include retraining, internships, counseling, and in-service training.

5. The practicing teacher assistance programs established under this section shall include, but need not be limited to, programs of professional development and improvement as provided for experienced teachers by the professional development committee established under subsection 4 of this section, and in-service opportunities as provided by the local school district for all practicing teachers.

90 6. (1) The administrator assistance programs established under this 91 section shall include, but shall not be limited to, programs of professional 92 development and improvement for superintendents, principals, assistant 93 principals, and other school district personnel charged with administrative duties.

94 (2) Establishment of programs by local districts and organizations for the 95 training of school board members are encouraged and recommended.

- 96 7. As an alternative to the requirements of this section, the board
- 97 of education of each school district may establish and adopt a written
- 98 $\,$ comprehensive professional development program for its teachers.

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
