## AN ACT

To repeal section 162.1250, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to virtual schools.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 162.1250, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 162.1250, to read as follows:

162.1250. 1. School districts shall receive state school funding under  $\mathbf{2}$ sections 163.031, 163.043, and 163.087 for resident students who are enrolled in 3 the school district and who are taking a virtual course or full-time virtual program offered by the school district. The school district may offer instruction 4 in a virtual setting using technology, intranet, and Internet methods of 5 communications that could take place outside of the regular school district 6 facility. The school district may develop a virtual program for any grade level, 7 8 kindergarten through twelfth grade, with the courses available in accordance with 9 district policy to any resident student of the district who is enrolled in the school 10 district. Nothing in this section shall preclude a private, parochial, or home 11 school student residing within a school district offering virtual courses or virtual programs from enrolling in the school district in accordance with the combined 12enrollment provisions of section 167.031 for the purposes of participating in the 13 virtual courses or virtual programs. 14

Charter schools shall receive state school funding under section 160.415
 for students enrolled in the charter school who are completing a virtual course or
 full-time virtual program offered by the charter school. Charter schools may offer
 instruction in a virtual setting using technology, intranet, and Internet methods
 of communications. The charter school may develop a virtual program for any

20 grade level, kindergarten through twelfth grade, with the courses available in 21 accordance with school policy and the charter school's charter to any student 22 enrolled in the charter school.

233. For purposes of calculation and distribution of state school funding, 24attendance of a student enrolled in a district or charter school virtual class shall equal, upon course completion, ninety-four percent of the hours of attendance 2526possible for such class delivered in the nonvirtual program in the student's 27resident district or charter school. Course completion shall be calculated in two 28increments, fifty percent completion and one hundred percent completion, based 29on the student's completion of defined assignments and assessments, with 30 distribution of state funding to a school district or charter school at each 31increment equal to forty-seven percent of hours of attendance possible for such 32course delivered in the nonvirtual program in a student's school district of 33 residence or charter school.

344. Any student who is a resident of this state may enroll in a school district other than his or her school district of residence or in 35 36 a charter school for the purpose of attending virtual courses or programs. For purposes of this subsection, "virtual nonresident 37students" shall mean nonresident students who enroll in a school 38 district or charter school for the purpose of attending virtual courses 39 or programs. School districts or charter schools may enroll any virtual 40 nonresident student. School districts and charter schools shall admit 41 students under this subsection based on the time of submission of an 42 43application for enrollment until full capacity is reached. A school district or charter school shall give a preference to a sibling of a 44 student already enrolled. A student who enrolls in another school 45district or charter school under this subsection may remain enrolled 46 until he or she has completed all grade levels offered or he or she 47withdraws from the school. For purposes of calculation and 48 49 distribution of state school funding for virtual nonresident students, 50the virtual nonresident student shall be included in the average daily attendance of his or her school district of residence. The virtual 5152nonresident student's district of residence shall pay the school district or charter school providing such virtual education an amount equal to 53seventy-two and one-half percent of the previous year's statewide 54average current expenditure per average daily attendance but not to 55

56 exceed the school district's current expenditure per average daily 57 attendance, provided that the total amount paid by any district shall 58 not exceed the total amount due to the district under subsections 1 and 59 2 of section 163.031.

60 5. In addition to those entities which may sponsor charter schools under section 160.400, any institution of higher education with 61 its primary campus located in Missouri with an approved teacher 62education program may sponsor virtual charter schools. Virtual 63 64 charter schools are charter schools and subject to all of the applicable provisions of sections 160.400 to 160.425 and this section. Virtual 65 charter schools may only offer instruction in a virtual setting using 66 technology, intranet and internet methods of communication. 67

68 **6.** When courses are purchased from an outside vendor, the district or 69 charter school shall ensure that they are aligned with the show-me curriculum 70 standards and comply with state requirements for teacher certification. The state 71 board of education reserves the right to request information and materials 72 sufficient to evaluate the online course. Online classes should be considered like 73 any other class offered by the school district or charter school.

[5.] 7. Any school district or charter school that offers instruction in a
virtual setting, develops a virtual course or courses, or develops a virtual program
of instruction shall ensure that the following standards are satisfied:

(1) The virtual course or virtual program utilizes appropriatecontent-specific tools and software;

79 (2) Orientation training is available for teachers, instructors, and students80 as needed;

81 (3) Privacy policies are stated and made available to teachers, instructors,
82 and students;

(4) Academic integrity and Internet etiquette expectations regarding
lesson activities, discussions, electronic communications, and plagiarism are
stated to teachers, instructors, and students prior to the beginning of the virtual
course or virtual program;

87 (5) Computer system requirements, including hardware, web browser, and
88 software, are specified to participants;

(6) The virtual course or virtual program architecture, software, and
hardware permit the online teacher or instructor to add content, activities, and
assessments to extend learning opportunities;

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92 (7) The virtual course or virtual program makes resources available by 93 alternative means, including but not limited to, video and podcasts;

94 (8) Resources and notes are available for teachers and instructors in 95 addition to assessment and assignment answers and explanations;

96 (9) Technical support and course management are available to the virtual 97 course or virtual program teacher and school coordinator;

98 (10) The virtual course or virtual program includes assignments, projects,
99 and assessments that are aligned with students' different visual, auditory, and
100 hands-on learning styles;

101 (11) The virtual course or virtual program demonstrates the ability to
102 effectively use and incorporate subject-specific and developmentally appropriate
103 software in an online learning module; and

104 (12) The virtual course or virtual program arranges media and content to105 help transfer knowledge most effectively in the online environment.

[6.] 8. Any special school district shall count any student's completion of
a virtual course or program in the same manner as the district counts completion
of any other course or program for credit.

109 [7.] 9. A school district or charter school may contract with multiple 110 providers of virtual courses or virtual programs, provided they meet the criteria 111 for virtual courses or virtual programs under this section.
