## AN ACT

To repeal sections 57.955 and 488.024, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the sheriffs' retirement fund.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 57.955 and 488.024, RSMo, are repealed and two new

- 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 57.955 and 488.024, to
- 3 read as follows:

57.955. 1. There shall be assessed and collected a surcharge of [three]

- 2 **two** dollars in all civil actions filed in the courts of this state and in all criminal
- 3 cases including violation of any county or municipal ordinance or any violation
- 4 of criminal or traffic laws of this state, including infractions and municipal
- 5 **ordinance violations**, but no such surcharge shall be assessed when the costs
- 6 are waived or are to be paid by the state, county or municipality or when a
- 7 criminal proceeding or the defendant has been dismissed by the court. For
- 8 purposes of this section, the term "county ordinance" shall not include any
- 9 ordinance of the city of St. Louis. The clerk responsible for collecting court costs
- 10 in civil and criminal cases, shall collect and disburse such amounts as provided
- 11 by sections 488.010 to 488.020. Such funds shall be payable to the sheriffs'
- 12 retirement fund. Moneys credited to the sheriffs' retirement fund shall be used
- 13 only for the purposes provided for in sections 57.949 to 57.997 and for no other
- 14 purpose.
- 15 2. The board may accept gifts, donations, grants and bequests from public
- 16 or private sources to the sheriffs' retirement fund.

488.024. As provided by [section 57.955] sections 57.949 to 57.997, there shall be assessed and collected a surcharge of three dollars in all civil actions filed in the courts of this state and in all criminal cases including violation of any county or municipal ordinance or any violation of criminal or traffic laws of this state, including infractions and municipal ordinance violations, but no such surcharge shall be assessed when the costs are waived or are to be paid by the state, county or municipality or when a criminal proceeding or the defendant has been dismissed by the court. For purposes of this section, the term "county ordinance" shall not include any ordinance of the 9 City of St. Louis. The clerk responsible for collecting court costs in civil and 10 criminal cases shall collect and disburse such amounts as provided by sections 11 12 488.010 to 488.020. Such funds shall be payable to the sheriffs' retirement fund.
