### AN ACT

To amend chapter 221, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to reporting requirements for employees of jails, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 221, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 221.313, to read as follows:

  221.313. 1. When any employee of a county or city jail has
- 2 reasonable cause to believe that an offender in a county or city jail has
- 3 been abused, such employee shall immediately report it in writing to
- 4 the person defined in section 221.020 as having custody, rule, keeping,
- 5 and charge of the jail.
- 6 2. The written report shall contain the name and address of the
- jail, the name of the offender, information regarding the nature of the
- 8 abuse, the name of the complainant, and any other information which
- 9 might be helpful in an investigation.
- 3. Any person required by subsection 1 of this section to report,
- 11 but who fails to do so within a reasonable time after the act of abuse is
- 12 guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
- 4. In addition to those persons required to report in subsection
- 14 1 of this section, any other person having reasonable cause to believe
- 15 that an offender has been abused may report such information as
- 16 provided under this section.
- 5. Upon receipt of a report, the person having custody, rule,
- 18 keeping, and charge of the jail shall initiate an investigation within
- 19 twenty-four hours.
- 20 6. If the investigation indicates possible abuse of an offender, the
- 21 investigator shall refer the complaint, together with a report, to the

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22 person having custody, rule, keeping, and charge of the jail for 23 appropriate action.

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7. Reports made pursuant to this section shall be confidential and shall not be deemed a public record for purposes of chapter 610

26 and shall not be open for inspection under section 109.180.
