AN ACT

To repeal sections 8.172 and 8.460, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the preferential use of the capitol complex by private entities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 8.172 and 8.460, RSMo, are repealed and two new

- 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 8.172 and 8.460, to read
- 3 as follows:
 - 8.172. 1. The commissioner of administration shall make rules and
- 2 regulations for the regulation of traffic and parking [at] for all parking space
- 3 upon the capitol grounds and upon the grounds of other state buildings located
- 4 within the capital city. The regulations shall be enforced by the Missouri capitol
- 5 police.
- 6 2. No parking space upon the capitol grounds shall be
 - specifically designated or set aside for use by any person or entity that
- 8 is not an official or employee of the state of Missouri. All parking
- 9 spaces upon the capitol grounds that are not specifically designated for
- 10 use by officials or employees of the state of Missouri shall be
- designated and set aside for use by members of the general public;
- 12 provided that an appropriate amount of parking spaces may be
- 13 designated for handicapped parking.
 - 8.460. 1. The board of public buildings may build an office building in the
- 2 City of Jefferson to house state offices which are presently located in rented
- 3 quarters within the county of Cole, and they shall remove as many offices from
- 4 the State Capitol building as the general assembly deems necessary to provide

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5 adequate office space for its members.

- 6 2. The building may be paid for as provided by sections 8.370 to 8.450.
- 7 3. Any person or entity that is not an official or employee of the
- 8 state of Missouri shall not be allowed an office or reserved space in the
- 9 State Capitol building; and any person or entity that is not an official
- 10 or employee of the state maintaining such an office or reserved space
- 11 shall remove its office or space from the State Capitol building on or
- 12 before August 28, 2014. For purposes of this subsection, the term "State
- 13 Capitol building" shall not include the senate and house chambers and
- 14 any galleries of such chambers.
