AN ACT

To repeal section 488.607, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to criminal case surcharges for counties or cities with domestic violence shelters.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 488.607, RSMo, is repealed and one new section
2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 488.607, to read as follows:

488.607. The governing body of any county or any city having a shelter for
2 victims of domestic violence established pursuant to sections 455.200 to 455.230,
3 or any municipality within a county which has such shelter, or any county or
4 municipality whose residents are victims of domestic violence and are admitted
5 to such shelters in another county, may, by order or ordinance provide for an
6 additional surcharge in the amount of [two] **four** dollars per case for each
7 criminal case, including violations of any county or municipal ordinance.

8 No surcharge shall be collected in any proceeding when the proceeding or
9 defendant has been dismissed by the court or when costs are to be paid by the
10 state, county or municipality. Such surcharges collected by municipal clerks in
11 municipalities electing or required to have violations of municipal ordinances
12 tried before a municipal judge pursuant to section 479.020, or to employ judicial
13 personnel pursuant to section 479.060, shall be disbursed to the city at least
14 monthly, and such surcharges collected by circuit court clerks shall be collected
15 and disbursed as provided by sections 488.010 to 488.020. Such fees shall be
16 payable to the city or county wherein such fees originated. The county or city
17 shall use such moneys only for the purpose of providing operating expenses for
