## AN ACT

To repeal section 105.010, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to gubernatorial appointments.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 105.010, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 26.305 and 105.010, to read as

3 follows:

26.305. Whenever the governor shall appoint a department head or a member of a board or commission pursuant to authority granted by section 51, article IV, of the Missouri Constitution, and such appointment is denoted as an acting or otherwise temporary appointment in the abstract maintained by the secretary of state under section 28.060, and such appointment is not submitted to the senate for 7 its advice and consent, the authority of the acting or temporary department head or board or commission member shall terminate according to the provisions of this section. For an acting department 10 head or member of a board or commission appointed when the senate is in regular or special session, the authority of such person to act shall 11 12terminate thirty days after the appointment or the final date of such session, whichever date comes first. For an acting department head or member of a board or commission appointed when the senate is not in regular or special session, the authority of such person to act shall 15 terminate thirty days after the senate has convened in the next regular 16 or special session. Such acting appointee shall not be appointed by the 17 18 governor to subsequently serve as acting department head for the same department or as an acting member of the same board or commission.

105.010. All officers elected or appointed by the authority of the laws of

this state shall hold their offices until their successors are elected or appointed, commissioned and qualified. For any person appointed by the governor to a board or commission pursuant to authority granted by section 51, article IV, of the Missouri Constitution, such appointee shall have authority to act during the pendency of the term of the office and for up to sixty days after the expiration of the term of the office. If the governor fails to fill the vacancy created by the expiration of the term of the office, then the board or commission position shall become vacant sixty days after the expiration of the person's term.
