## AN ACT

To repeal sections 50.660 and 50.783, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to county purchases.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 50.660 and 50.783, RSMo, are repealed and two new 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 50.660 and 50.783, to 3 read as follows:

50.660. 1. All contracts shall be executed in the name of the county, or in the name of a township in a county with a township form of government, by the 2 3 head of the department or officer concerned, except contracts for the purchase of supplies, materials, equipment or services other than personal made by the officer 4 in charge of purchasing in any county or township having the officer. No contract 5or order imposing any financial obligation on the county or township is binding 6 on the county or township unless it is in writing and unless there is a balance 7 otherwise unencumbered to the credit of the appropriation to which it is to be 8 9 charged and a cash balance otherwise unencumbered in the treasury to the credit 10 of the fund from which payment is to be made, each sufficient to meet the obligation incurred and unless the contract or order bears the certification of the 11 accounting officer so stating; except that in case of any contract for public works 12or buildings to be paid for from bond funds or from taxes levied for the purpose 13 it is sufficient for the accounting officer to certify that the bonds or taxes have 14 been authorized by vote of the people and that there is a sufficient unencumbered 15amount of the bonds yet to be sold or of the taxes levied and yet to be collected 16 to meet the obligation in case there is not a sufficient unencumbered cash balance 17in the treasury. All contracts and purchases shall be let to the lowest and best 18

bidder after due opportunity for competition, including advertising the proposed 19 20letting in a newspaper in the county or township with a circulation of at least five hundred copies per issue, if there is one, except that the advertising is not 2122required in case of contracts or purchases involving an expenditure of less than 23six thousand dollars. It is not necessary to obtain bids on any purchase in the amount of four thousand five hundred dollars or less made from any one person, 24firm or corporation during any period of ninety days or, if the county is any 2526county of the first classification with more than one hundred fifty thousand but 27fewer than two hundred thousand inhabitants, [or] any county of the first 28classification with more than two hundred sixty thousand but fewer than three 29hundred thousand inhabitants, or any county of the second classification 30 with more than seventy-five thousand but fewer than one hundred 31thousand inhabitants, it is not necessary to obtain bids on such purchases in 32the amount of six thousand dollars or less. All bids for any contract or purchase 33 may be rejected and new bids advertised for. Contracts which provide that the person contracting with the county or township shall, during the term of the 3435contract, furnish to the county or township at the price therein specified the supplies, materials, equipment or services other than personal therein described, 36 37 in the quantities required, and from time to time as ordered by the officer in 38charge of purchasing during the term of the contract, need not bear the certification of the accounting officer, as herein provided; but all orders for 39 supplies, materials, equipment or services other than personal shall bear the 40 41 certification. In case of such contract, no financial obligation accrues against the 42county or township until the supplies, materials, equipment or services other than personal are so ordered and the certificate furnished. 43

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 1 of this section to the
contrary, advertising shall not be required in any county in the case of contracts
or purchases involving an expenditure of less than six thousand dollars.

50.783. 1. The county commission may waive the requirement of competitive bids or proposals for supplies when the commission has determined in writing and entered into the commission minutes that there is only a single feasible source for the supplies. Immediately upon discovering that other feasible sources exist, the commission shall rescind the waiver and proceed to procure the supplies through the competitive processes as described in this chapter. A single feasible source exists when:

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(1) Supplies are proprietary and only available from the manufacturer or

9 a single distributor; or

10 (2) Based on past procurement experience, it is determined that only one11 distributor services the region in which the supplies are needed; or

12 (3) Supplies are available at a discount from a single distributor for a13 limited period of time.

142. On any single feasible source purchase where the estimated expenditure is three thousand dollars or over, the commission shall post notice 15of the proposed purchase. Where the estimated expenditure is five thousand 16 dollars or over, the commission shall also advertise the commission's intent to 17make such purchase in at least one daily and one weekly newspaper of general 18 19 circulation in such places as are most likely to reach prospective bidders or 20offerors and may provide such information through an electronic medium 21available to the general public at least ten days before the contract is to be let.

3. Notwithstanding subsection 2 of this section to the contrary, on any
single feasible service purchase by:

(1) Any county of the first classification with more than one hundred fiftythousand but fewer than two hundred thousand inhabitants; [or]

(2) Any county of the first classification with more than two hundred sixty
thousand but fewer than three hundred thousand inhabitants; or

(3) Any county of the second classification with more than
29 seventy-five thousand but fewer than one hundred thousand
30 inhabitants;

where the estimated expenditure is six thousand dollars or over, the commission shall post notice of the proposed purchase and advertise the commission's intent to make such purchase in at least one daily and one weekly newspaper of general circulation in such places as are most likely to reach prospective bidders or offerors and may provide such information through an electronic medium available to the general public at least ten days before the contract is to be let.

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
