SECOND REGULAR SESSION SENATE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 1490

97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Reported from the Committee on Education, April 23, 2014, with recommendation that the Senate Committee Substitute do pass. 4476S.03C TERRY L. SPIELER, Secretary.

AN ACT

To repeal sections 160.514 and 161.022, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to elementary and secondary education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 160.514 and 161.022, RSMo, are repealed and three 2 new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 160.514, 161.022, 3 and 161.855, to read as follows:

160.514. 1. By rule and regulation, and consistent with the provisions contained in section 160.526, the state board of education shall adopt no more than seventy-five academic performance standards which establish the knowledge, skills and competencies necessary for students to successfully advance through the public elementary and secondary education system of this state; lead to or qualify a student for high school graduation; prepare students for postsecondary education or the workplace or both; and are necessary in this era to preserve the rights and liberties of the people.

9 2. [The state board of education shall convene work groups composed of education professionals to develop and recommend academic performance 10 standards.] Whenever the state board of education develops, evaluates, 11 12 modifies, or revises academic performance standards or learning 13 standards, it shall convene work groups composed of education professionals to develop and recommend such academic performance 14 15standards or learning standards. Separate work groups composed of 16 education professionals with appropriate expertise shall be convened for [each subject area listed in section 160.518. Active classroom teachers shall constitute 1718 the majority of each work group. Teachers] the following subject areas: 19 English language arts; mathematics; science; and history and

20 governments. The subject area of history and governments shall 21incorporate geography and the history and governments of the United 22States and the world. For each subject area in which the state board of education develops, evaluates, modifies, or revises academic 2324performance standards or learning standards, the state board shall convene two separate work groups, one work group for standards for 2526grades kindergarten through five and a second work group for standards for grades six through twelve. Each work group shall consist 2728of fourteen members. An education professional serving on a work group shall be a Missouri resident for at least three years and have 2930 taught in the work group's subject area for at least ten years or have 31ten years of experience in that subject area. Education professionals serving on [such] work groups shall be selected by the following entities and 3233 persons: professional teachers' organizations of the state, a statewide association of Missouri school boards, a statewide association of 34 35charter schools, a statewide association of school administrators, the speaker of the house of representatives, the president pro tempore of 36 37the senate, the governor, the lieutenant governor, the commissioner of higher education, and the heads of state-approved baccalaureate-level 38 39 teacher preparation programs located in Missouri. Each entity or 40 person shall select one member for each work group. The professional 41 teachers' organizations shall collectively select one person for each 42work group. The heads of the state-approved baccalaureate-level 43 teacher preparation programs shall collectively select one person for each work group. A person may be selected to serve on more than one 44 work group if he or she is qualified. Four members of the work group 4546 shall be parents of currently enrolled students in grades kindergarten through twelve with two selected by the president pro tempore of the 47senate and two selected by the speaker of the house of 48 representatives. [Additional teachers who are not members of such 49 organizations may serve by appointment of the state board of education.] No 50 work group member shall be required to be a member of a professional 51teacher association. The state board of education shall hold at least 52three public hearings whenever it develops, evaluates, modifies, or 53revises academic performance standards or learning standards. The 54hearings shall provide an opportunity to receive public testimony, 55including but not limited to testimony from educators at all levels in 56

57the state, local school boards, parents, representatives from business and industry, labor and community leaders, members of the general 58assembly, and the general public. The state board of education shall 59hold the first hearing within thirty days of the work groups being 60 convened. The state board of education shall hold the second hearing 61 approximately six months after it holds the first hearing. The state 62 board of education shall hold the third hearing when the work groups 63 submit the academic performance standards they have developed to the 64 65 state board. The state board of education shall also solicit comments and feedback on the academic performance standards or learning 66 standards from the joint committee on education and from academic 67 researchers. All comments shall be made publicly available. 68

69 3. The state board of education shall develop written curriculum 70 frameworks that may be used by school districts. Such curriculum frameworks 71 shall incorporate the academic performance standards adopted by the state board 72 of education pursuant to subsection 1 of this section. The curriculum frameworks 73 shall provide guidance to school districts but shall not be mandates for local 74 school boards in the adoption or development of written curricula as required by 75 subsection 4 of this section.

764. Not later than one year after the development of written curriculum frameworks pursuant to subsection 3 of this section, the board of education of 77 each school district in the state shall adopt or develop a written curriculum 7879 designed to ensure that students attain the knowledge, skills and competencies established pursuant to subsection 1 of this section. Local school boards are 80 encouraged to adopt or develop curricula that are rigorous and ambitious and 81 may, but are not required to, use the curriculum frameworks developed pursuant 82 83 to subsection 3 of this section. Nothing in this section or this act shall prohibit 84 school districts, as determined by local boards of education, to develop or adopt 85 curricula that provide for academic standards in addition to those identified by the state board of education pursuant to subsection 1 of this section. 86

5. Local school districts and charter schools may adopt their own education standards, in addition to those already adopted by the state, provided the additional standards are in the public domain.

161.022. 1. The state board of education consists of eight lay members
2 appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, after
3 an open committee hearing. The term of office of each member is eight years. At

4 the expiration of the term of each member, the governor, by and with the advice
5 and consent of the senate, shall appoint a successor. If the general assembly is
6 not in session at the time for making an appointment, the governor shall make
7 a temporary appointment as in the case of a vacancy.

8 2. After August 28, 2014, no member shall serve more than two 9 terms on the state board of education and any member who has already 10 served two or more terms on the board shall be ineligible to serve an 11 additional term. In applying this subsection, serving a term for less 12 than four years shall not be counted.

13 3. No member may be removed by the governor except after written notice14 and hearing on charges of malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance in office.

[3.] 4. Each member of the board shall receive as compensation for his
services twenty-five dollars for each day actually spent in attendance at board
meetings, and in addition shall be reimbursed for all necessary expenses incurred
in the performance of his duties as a member of the board.

161.855. 1. By October 1, 2014, the state board of education shall $\mathbf{2}$ convene work groups composed of education professionals to develop and recommend new academic performance standards in place of the 3 common core state standards. The work groups shall be composed of 4 individuals as provided in section 160.514. The state board of 5 education and the work groups shall follow the procedures and conduct 6 7 the public hearings required by section 160.514. The state board of education shall convene separate work groups for the following subject 8 9 areas: English language arts; mathematics; science; and history and governments. For each of these four subject areas, the state board of 10 education shall convene two separate work groups, one work group for 11 12grades kindergarten through five and another work group for grades six through twelve. 13

2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall pilot assessments from the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium during the 2014-2015 school year for every school district and charter school in the state. The results of the statewide pilot shall not be used for high stakes accountability or teacher evaluations or to lower any school district's accreditation.

The work groups shall develop and recommend new academic
 performance standards that meet the needs of the students of the state
 to the state board of education by October 1, 2015. The work groups

shall report on their progress in developing the academic performance
standards to the president pro tempore of the senate and the speaker
of the house of representatives on a monthly basis.

4. The state board of education shall adopt and implement new academic performance standards beginning in the 2016-2017 school year. The state board of education shall align the statewide assessment system to the new academic performance standards as needed within three years of adopting new academic performance standards.

5. Any person performing work for a school district or charter school for which teacher certification or administrator certification is regularly required under the laws relating to the certification of teachers or administrators shall be an employee of the school district or charter school. All evaluations of any such person shall be maintained in the teacher's or administrator's personnel file and shall not be shared with any state or federal agency.
