AN ACT

To amend chapter 334, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the registration of radiology technologists.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 334, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 334.980, to read as follows:

334.980. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

- (1) "Advanced radiology practitioner", a radiologist assistant certified by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists or a nuclear medicine advanced associate certified by the Nuclear Medicine Technology Certification Board who has specific qualifications, certifications, and responsibilities as recognized by the state board of registration for the healing arts and who has been licensed to perform certain functions under the supervision of a certified radiation practitioner;
- 12 (2) "Certified radiation practitioner", a person licensed to 12 practice medicine, dentistry, podiatry, chiropractic, osteopathy, or 13 optometry in this state;
- 14 (3) "Radiologic technologist", a radiographer, radiation therapist,
 15 nuclear medicine technologist, or magnetic resonance technologist
 16 certified by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists or a
 17 nuclear medicine technologist certified by the Nuclear Medicine
 18 Technology Certification Board who has specific qualifications,
 19 certifications, and responsibilities as recognized by the state board of
 20 registration for the healing arts and who has been licensed to perform
 21 certain functions under the supervision of a certified radiation

 2. No person shall hold himself or herself out as an advanced radiology practitioner or radiologic technologist or perform imaging or treatment using ionizing radiation or magnetic resonance unless such person has been licensed by the state board of registration for the healing arts within the division of professional registration as an advanced radiology practitioner or a radiologic technologist.

3. The board of registration for the healing arts may promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly under chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall be invalid and void.
