AN ACT

To repeal section 261.241, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to honey.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 261.241, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 261.241, to read as follows:

- 261.241. 1. Sellers of [jams, jellies, and] honey whose annual sales of
- 2 [jams, jellies, and] honey are [thirty] fifty thousand dollars or less per domicile
- 3 shall not be required to construct or maintain separate facilities for the
- 4 [manufacture] bottling of [jams, jellies, and] honey. Such sellers shall be
- 5 exempt from all remaining health standards and regulations for the
- 6 [manufacture] bottling of [jams, jellies, and] honey pursuant to sections 196.190
- 7 to 196.271 if they meet the following requirements:
- 8 (1) [Jams, jellies, and] Honey shall be [manufactured] bottled in the
- 9 domicile of the person [processing] harvesting and selling the [jams, jellies,
- 10 and honey [and sold by the manufacturer to the end consumer];
- 11 (2) [Jams, jellies, and] Honey shall be labeled with the following
- 12 information in legible English as set forth in subsection 2 of this section;
- 13 (3) [During the sale of such jams, jellies, and honey, a placard shall be
- 14 displayed in a prominent location stating the following: "This product has not
- 15 been inspected by the Department of Health and Senior Services.";
- 16 (4)] Annual gross sales shall not exceed [thirty] fifty thousand

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- 17 dollars. The person [manufacturing] harvesting such [jams, jellies, and] honey
- 18 shall maintain a record of sales of [jams, jellies, and] honey [processed] bottled
- 19 and sold. The record shall be available to the regulatory authority when
- 20 requested.

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- 2. The [jams, jellies, and] honey shall be labeled with the following 22 information:
 - (1) Name and address of the persons preparing the food;
- 24 (2) Common name of the food; and
- 25 (3) The name of all ingredients in the food[; and
- 26 (4) Statement that the jams, jellies, and honey have not been inspected
- 27 by the department of health and senior services].
- 3. Sellers of [jams, jellies, and] honey who violate the provisions of this
- 29 section may be enjoined from selling [jams, jellies, and] honey by the department
- 30 of health and senior services.
