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AN ACT

To repeal section 227.297, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof nine new sections relating to bridge and highway designations.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Section 227.297, RSMo, is repealed and nine new sections  
2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 227.297, 227.380, 227.417,  
3 227.419, 227.428, 227.523, 227.524, 227.525, and 227.526, to read as follows:

227.297. 1. This section establishes [an interchange] a designation  
2 program, to be known as the "Heroes Way [Interchange] Designation Program",  
3 to honor the fallen Missouri heroes who have been killed in action while  
4 performing active military duty with the Armed Forces [in Afghanistan or Iraq  
5 on or after September 11, 2001]. The signs shall be placed upon interstate or  
6 state-numbered highway interchanges **or upon bridges or segments of**

7 **highway on the state highway system** in accordance with this section, and  
8 any applicable federal and state limitations or conditions on highway signage,  
9 including location and spacing.

10 2. Any person who is related by marriage, adoption, or consanguinity  
11 within the second degree to a member of the United States Armed Forces who  
12 was killed in action while performing active military duty with the Armed Forces  
13 [in Afghanistan or Iraq on or after September 11, 2001], and who was a resident  
14 of this state at the time he or she was killed in action, may apply for [an  
15 interchange] a designation under the provisions of this section.

16 3. Any person described under subsection 2 of this section who desires to  
17 have an interstate or state numbered highway interchange **or bridge or**  
18 **segment of highway on the state highway system** designated after his or  
19 her family member shall petition the department of transportation by submitting  
20 the following:

21 (1) An application in a form prescribed by the director, describing the  
22 interstate or state numbered highway interchange **or bridge or segment of**  
23 **highway on the state highway system** for which the designation is sought  
24 and the proposed name of the interchange, **bridge or relevant segment of**  
25 **highway**. The application shall include the name of at least one current member  
26 of the general assembly who will sponsor the [interchange] designation. The  
27 application may contain written testimony for support of the [interchange]  
28 designation;

29 (2) Proof that the family member killed in action was a member of the  
30 United States Armed Forces and proof that such family member was in fact killed  
31 in action while performing active military duty with the United States Armed  
32 Forces [in Afghanistan or Iraq on or after September 11, 2001]. Acceptable proof  
33 shall be a statement from the Missouri veterans commission or the United States  
34 Department of Veterans Affairs so certifying such facts;

35 (3) By signing a form provided by the Missouri transportation department,  
36 the applicant shall certify that the applicant is related by marriage, adoption, or  
37 consanguinity within the second degree to the member of the United States  
38 Armed Forces who was killed in action; and

39 (4) A fee to be determined by the commission to cover the costs of  
40 constructing and maintaining the proposed interchange, **bridge, or highway**  
41 signs. The fee shall not exceed the cost of constructing and maintaining each

42 sign.

43 4. All moneys received by the department of transportation for the  
44 construction and maintenance of interchange, **bridge, or highway** signs shall  
45 be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the state road fund.

46 5. The documents and fees required under this section shall be submitted  
47 to the department of transportation.

48 6. The department of transportation shall submit for approval or  
49 disapproval all applications for [interchange] designations to the joint committee  
50 on transportation oversight. The joint committee on transportation oversight may  
51 review such applications at any scheduled meeting convened pursuant to section  
52 21.795. If satisfied with the application and all its contents, the committee shall  
53 approve the application. The committee shall notify the department of  
54 transportation upon the approval or denial of an application for [an interchange]  
55 a designation.

56 7. The department of transportation shall give notice of any proposed  
57 [interchange] designation under this section in a manner reasonably calculated  
58 to advise the public of such proposal. Reasonable notice shall include posting the  
59 proposal for the designation on the department's official public website and  
60 making available copies of the sign designation application to any representative  
61 of the news media or public upon request and posting the application on a  
62 bulletin board or other prominent public place which is easily accessible to the  
63 public and clearly designated for that purpose at the principal office.

64 8. If the memorial [interchange] designation request is not approved by  
65 the joint committee on transportation oversight, ninety-seven percent of the  
66 application fee shall be refunded to the applicant.

67 9. Two signs shall be erected for each interchange, **bridge, or highway**  
68 designation processed under this section.

69 10. No interchange, **bridge, or highway** may be named or designated  
70 after more than one member of the United States Armed Forces killed in  
71 action. Such person shall only be eligible for one interchange, **bridge, or**  
72 **highway** designation under the provisions of this section.

73 11. Any highway signs erected for any [interchange] designation under  
74 the provisions of this section shall be erected and maintained for a twenty-year  
75 period. After such period, the signs shall be subject to removal by the  
76 department of transportation and the interchange, **bridge, or highway** may be

77 designated to honor persons other than the current designee. An existing  
78 [interchange] designation processed under the provisions of this section may be  
79 retained for additional twenty-year increments if, at least one year before the  
80 designation's expiration, an application to the department of transportation is  
81 made to retain the designation along with the required documents and all  
82 applicable fees required under this section.

**227.380. The portion of State Highway 115 in St. Louis City from  
2 the intersection of Natural Bridge Avenue and Salisbury Street west to  
3 the intersection of State Highway 115 and Jennings Station Road shall  
4 be designated the "Theodore McNeal Highway". Cost for such  
5 designation shall be paid by private donations.**

**227.417. The portion of U.S. Highway 160 in Ozark County from  
2 the bridge that crosses Bryant Creek to a location two and one-half  
3 miles east of such bridge shall be known as the "Jerry Corp Memorial  
4 Highway". The costs for such designation shall be paid by private  
5 donations.**

**227.419. The portion of Highway 63 from the Adair-Macon County  
2 line to the northern border of the city limits of the city of Kirksville  
3 shall be designated the "Harriet Beard Highway". The department of  
4 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating  
5 such highway with costs to be paid by private donations.**

**227.428. The portion of Business Highway 71 from the Interstate  
2 29 intersection traveling north for two miles and located in Andrew  
3 County shall be designated as the "Randy Bever Memorial  
4 Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain  
5 appropriate signs designating such highway with the cost for such  
6 designation to be paid by private donation.**

**227.523. The bridge on Highway CC crossing over North Fork  
2 White River in Ozark County shall be designated the "Irwin C.  
3 Cudworth Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall  
4 erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the  
5 costs of such designation to be paid for by private donations.**

**227.524. The portion of Highway 10 from the western border of  
2 the city limits of Norborne in Carroll County to the eastern border of  
3 the city limits of Hardin in Ray County shall be designated the "Ray-**

4 Carroll County Veterans Memorial Highway". The department of  
5 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating  
6 such highway with costs to be paid by private donations.

227.525. The portion of U.S. Highway 160 in Ripley County which  
2 is located within the city limits of Doniphan shall be designated the  
3 "Billy Yates Highway". The department of transportation shall erect  
4 and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the  
5 costs to be paid for by private donation.

227.526. The portion of Highway 54 from the Grand Glaize Bridge  
2 in Camden County to Key Largo Road in Camden County shall be  
3 designated the "Veterans Memorial Expressway". The department of  
4 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating  
5 such highway with costs to be paid by private donations.
