Amend SS/HCS/House Bill No. 1877, Page 6, Section 210.118, Line 17,

2 of said page, by inserting after all of said line the following:

3 "210.146. 1. Upon receipt of a report of child abuse or
4 neglect concerning a child three years of age or younger and the
5 children's division's determination that such report merits an
6 investigation, such investigation shall include an evaluation of
7 the child by a SAFE CARE provider, as defined in section 334.950,
8 or a review of the child's case file and photographs of the
9 child's injuries by a SAFE CARE provider.

10 2. When a SAFE CARE provider makes a diagnosis that a child
11 three years of age or younger has been subjected to physical
12 abuse, including but not limited to symptoms indicative of
13 abusive bruising, fractures, burns, abdominal injuries, or head
14 trauma, and reports such diagnosis to the children's division,
15 the division shall immediately submit a referral to the juvenile
16 officer. The referral shall include the division's
17 recommendations to the juvenile officer regarding the care,
18 safety, and placement of the child and the reasons for those
19 recommendations.

20 210.180. Each employee of the division who is responsible
21 for the investigation or family assessment of reports of

1 suspected child abuse or neglect shall receive not less than
2 forty hours of preservice training on the identification and
3 treatment of child abuse and neglect. In addition to such
4 preservice training such employee shall also receive not less
5 than twenty hours of in-service training each year on the subject
6 of the identification and treatment of child abuse and neglect.

7 Such annual training shall include at least four hours of medical
8 forensics relating to child abuse and neglect as approved by the
9 SAFE CARE network described in section 334.950."; and

10 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
