## AN ACT

To amend chapter 313, RSMo, by adding thereto twelve new sections relating to fantasy sports contests.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section A. Chapter 313, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
- twelve new sections, to be known as sections 313.900, 313.910,
- 3 313.920, 313.930, 313.940, 313.950, 313.960, 313.970, 313.990,
- 4 313.1000, 313.1010, and 313.1020, to read as follows:
- 5 <u>313.900.</u> Sections 313.900 to 313.1020 shall be known and
- 6 may be cited as the "Missouri Fantasy Sports Consumer Protection
- 7 Act".
- 8 313.910. As used in sections 313.900 to 313.1020, the
- 9 following terms shall mean:
- 10 (1) "Authorized internet website", an internet website or
- any platform operated by a licensed operator;
- 12 (2) "Commission", the Missouri gaming commission;
- 13 (3) "Entry fee", anything of value including, but not
- limited to, cash or a cash equivalent, that a fantasy sports

1	contest operator collects in order to participate in a fantasy
2	sports contest;
3	(4) "Fantasy sports contest", any fantasy or simulated game
4	or contest with an entry fee, conducted on an internet website or
5	any platform, in which:
6	(a) The value of all prizes and awards offered to the
7	winning participants is established and made known in advance of
8	the contest;
9	(b) All winning outcomes reflect in part the relative
10	knowledge and skill of the participants and are determined
11	predominantly by the accumulated statistical results of the
12	performance of individuals, including athletes in the case of
13	sports events; and
14	(c) No winnings outcomes are based on the score, point
15	spread, or any performance of any single actual team or
16	combination of teams or solely on any single performance of an
17	individual athlete or player in any single actual event.
18	(5) "Fantasy sports contest operator", any person or entity
19	that offers fantasy sports contests for a prize;
20	(6) "Highly experienced player", a person who has either:
21	(a) Entered more than one-thousand contests offered by a
22	single fantasy sports contest operator; or
23	(b) Won more than three fantasy sports prizes of one-
24	thousand dollars or more;
25	(7) "Licensed operator", a fantasy sports contest operator

contests for play on an authorized internet website in Missouri;

(8) "Minor", any person less than eighteen years of age;

licensed pursuant to section 313.920 to offer fantasy sports

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1	(9) "Net revenue", for all fantasy sports contests, the
2	amount equal to the total entry fees collected from all
3	participants entering such fantasy sports contests less winnings
4	paid to participants in the contests, multiplied by the resident
5	<pre>percentage;</pre>
6	(10) "Player", a person who participates in a fantasy

(10) "Player", a person who participates in a fantasy sports contest offered by a fantasy sports contest operator;

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- 8 (11) "Prize", anything of value including, but not limited 9 to, cash or a cash equivalent, contest credits, merchandise, or 10 admission to another contest in which a prize may be awarded;
- (12) "Registered player", a person registered pursuant to section 313.940 to participate in a fantasy sports contest on an authorized internet website; 13
  - (13) "Resident percentage", for all fantasy sports contests, the percentage, rounded to nearest one-tenth of one percent, of the total entry fees collected from Missouri residents divided by the total entry fees collected from all players, regardless of the players' location, of the fantasy sports contests; and
  - (14) "Script", a list of commands that a fantasy-sportsrelated computer program can execute to automate processes on a fantasy sports contest platform;
  - 313.920. 1. A fantasy sports contest conducted under this chapter is exempt from chapter 572, and does not constitute gambling for any purpose.
  - 2. A fantasy sports contest operator shall apply for and receive a license from the commission prior to offering fantasy sports contests for play in Missouri.

1	3. The commission shall provide forms, to be completed by
2	applicants and made available on the commission's website, on
3	which the applicant shall demonstrate experience, reputation,
4	competence, and financial responsibility consistent with the best
5	interest of the Missouri fantasy sports industry and in
6	compliance with the laws of the state.

4. The commission may, in its sole discretion, refuse to license any applicant or revoke or suspend the license of any applicant or licensee if the applicant or licensee, or an employee of the applicant or licensee:

- (1) Has knowingly made a false statement of material fact or has deliberately failed to disclose any information requested;
- (2) Is or has pled quilty or been convicted of any illegal, corrupt, or fraudulent act, practice, or conduct in connection with any fantasy sports contest in this or any other state or has pled quilty or been convicted of a felony, a crime of moral turpitude, or any criminal offense involving dishonesty or breach of trust within the ten years prior to the date of application for registration;
- (3) Has at any time knowingly failed to comply with the provisions of this chapter or of any requirements of the commission;
- (4) Has had a registration or permit to hold or conduct fantasy sports contests denied for just cause, suspended, or revoked in any other state or country;
- 26 <u>(5) Has legally defaulted in the payment of any obligation</u>
  27 or debt owed to the State of Missouri; or
  - (6) Is not qualified to do business in the state of

- Missouri or is not subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the state of Missouri.
- 5. Fantasy sports contests as defined in section 313.910,
- 4 are authorized and may be conducted on an excursion gambling boat
- or adjacent property to the excursion gambling boat operated by
- 6 entities licensed under sections 313.807 and 313.920. A person
- 7 <u>under twenty-one years of age shall not participate in fantasy</u>
- 8 sports contests on an excursion gambling boat.
- 9 <u>313.930.</u> 1. In order to ensure the protection of
- 10 <u>registered players, an authorized internet website shall identify</u>
- 11 the person or entity that is the licensed operator.
- 12 <u>2. A licensed operator shall ensure that fantasy sports</u>
- contests on its authorized internet website comply with all of
- 14 the following:
- 15 <u>(1) All winning outcomes are determined by accumulated</u>
- 16 statistical results of fully completed contests or events, and
- not merely any portion thereof, except that fantasy participants
- 18 may be credited for statistical results accumulated in a
- 19 <u>suspended or shortened contest or event which has been called on</u>
- 20 account of weather or other natural or unforeseen event;
- 21 (2) A licensed <u>operator shall not allow registered players</u>
- 22 to select athletes through an auto-draft that does not involve
- any input or control by a registered player, or to choose
- 24 pre-selected teams of athletes;
- 25 (3) A licensed operator shall not offer or award a prize to
- the winner of, or athletes in, the underlying competition itself;
- 27 and
- 28 (4) A licensed operator shall not offer fantasy sports

- contests based on the performances of participants in collegiate,
- 2 <u>high school, or youth athletics.</u>

- 3 <u>3. A licensed operator shall have procedures approved by</u>
  4 <u>the commission before operating in Missouri that:</u>
- 5 <u>(1) Prevents unauthorized withdrawals from a registered</u> 6 player's account by the licensed operator or others;
- 7 (2) Makes clear that funds in a registered player's account
  8 are not the property of the licensed operator and are not
  9 available to the licensed operator's creditors;
  - (3) Segregate player funds from operational funds;
- 11 (4) Maintain a reserve in the form of cash or cash

  12 equivalents in the amount of the deposits made to the accounts of

  13 fantasy sports contest players for the benefit and protection of

  14 the funds held in such accounts;
  - (5) Ensures any prize won by a registered player from participating in a fantasy sports contest is deposited into the registered player's account within 48 hours of winning the prize;
  - maintained in their individual accounts, whether such accounts are open or closed, within five business days of the request being made, unless the licensed operator believes in good faith that the registered player engaged in either fraudulent conduct or other conduct that would put the licensed operator in violation of sections 313.900 to 313.1020, in which case the licensed operator may decline to honor the request for withdrawal for a reasonable investigatory period until its investigation is resolved if it provides notice of the nature of the investigation to the registered player. For the purposes of this provision, a

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- 2 processed by the licensed operator but delayed by a payment

- 5 (6) Allows a registered player to permanently close their
- account at any time for any reason; and
- 7 (7) Offers registered players access to their play history
- 8 <u>and account details.</u>
- 9 <u>4. A licensed operator shall establish procedures for a</u>
- 10 <u>registered player to report complaints to the licensed operator</u>
- 11 regarding whether his or her account has been misallocated,
- 12 <u>compromised</u>, or otherwise mishandled, and a procedure for the
- licensed operator to respond to those complaints.
- 5. A registered player who believes his or her account has
- been misallocated, compromised, or otherwise mishandled should
- notify the commission. Upon notification, the commission may
- 17 <u>investigate the claim and may take any action the commission</u>
- deems appropriate under subdivision (4) of section 313.1010.
- 19 <u>6. A licensed operator shall not issue credit to a</u>
- 20 registered player.
- 7. A licensed operator shall not allow a registered player
- to establish more than one account or user name on its authorized
- 23 internet website.
- 24 313.940. 1. A person shall register with a licensed
- 25 <u>operator prior to participating in fantasy sports contests on an</u>
- 26 authorized internet website.
- 2. A licensed operator shall implement appropriate security
- 28 standards to prevent access to fantasy sports contests by a

- person whose location and age have not been verified in
  accordance with this section.
- 3. A licensed operator shall ensure that all individuals
  4 register before participating in a fantasy sports contest on an
  5 authorized internet website and provide their age and state of
  6 residence.
- 4. A licensed operator shall ensure that an individual is
  of legal age before participating in fantasy sports contest on an
  authorized internet website. In Missouri, the legal age to
  participate shall be eighteen years of age.
- 5. (1) The licensed operator shall develop an online

  self-exclusion form and a process to exclude from play any person

  who has filled out the form.

- (2) A licensed operator shall retain each online self-exclusion form submitted to it in order to identify persons who want to be excluded from play. A licensed operator shall exclude those persons.
- (3) A licensed operator shall provide a link on its authorized internet website to a compulsive behavior website and the online self-exclusion form described in subdivision (1) of this subsection.
- 6. A licensed operator shall not advertise fantasy sports contests in publications or other media that are aimed exclusively or primarily at persons less than eighteen years of age. A licensed operator's advertisement shall not depict persons under eighteen years of age, students, or settings involving a school or college. However, incidental depiction of non-featured minors shall not be a violation of this subsection.

1	7. A licensed operator shall not advertise fantasy sports
2	contests to an individual by phone, email, or any other form of
3	individually targeted advertisement or marketing material if the
4	individual has self-excluded himself or herself pursuant to this
5	section or if the individual is otherwise barred from
6	participating in fantasy sports contests. A licensed operator
7	shall also take reasonable steps to ensure that individuals on
8	the involuntary exclusion list or disassociated persons list
9	maintained by the commission are not subject to any form of

8. A licensed operator shall not misrepresent the frequency or extent of winning in any fantasy sports contest advertisement.

individually targeted advertising or marketing.

- 9. A licensed operator shall clearly and conspicuously publish and facilitate parental control procedures to allow parents or quardians to exclude minors from access to any fantasy sports contest. Licensed operators shall take commercially reasonable steps to confirm that an individual opening an account is not a minor.
- 19 <u>10. Licensed operators shall prohibit the use of scripts in</u>
  20 <u>fantasy sports contests that give players an unfair advantage</u>
  21 <u>over other players.</u>
  - 11. Licensed operators shall monitor fantasy sports

    contests to detect the use of unauthorized scripts and restrict

    players found to have used such scripts from further fantasy

    sports contests.
  - 12. Licensed operators shall make all authorized scripts
    readily available to all fantasy sports players; provided, that a
    licensed operator shall clearly and conspicuously publish its

- 1 <u>rules on what types of scripts may be authorized in the fantasy</u>
- 2 sports contest.
- 3 <u>13. Licensed operators shall clearly and conspicuously</u>
- 4 identify highly experienced players in fantasy sports contests by
- 5 <u>a symbol attached to a player's username</u>, or by other easily
- 6 visible means, on the licensed operator's authorized internet
- 7 <u>website.</u>
- 8 <u>14. Licensed operators shall offer some fantasy sports</u>
- 9 contests open only to beginner players and that exclude highly
- 10 <u>experienced players.</u>
- 11 313.950. 1. This section applies to all of the following
- 12 <u>persons:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) An officer of a licensed operator;</u>
- 14 (2) A director of a licensed operator;
- 15 (3) A principal of a licensed operator;
- 16 (4) An employee of a licensed operator; and
- 17 <u>(5) A contractor of a licensed operator with proprietary or</u>
- 18 nonpublic information.
- 19 2. A person listed in subsection 1 of this section shall
- 20 not play any fantasy sports contest outside of private fantasy
- 21 sports contests offered by the licensed operator exclusively for
- 22 those listed.
- 23 3. A person listed in subsection 1 of this section shall
- 24 not disclose proprietary or nonpublic information that may affect
- 25 the play of fantasy sports contests to any individual authorized
- to play fantasy sports contests.
- 27 4. A licensed operator shall make the prohibitions in this
- section known to all affected individuals and corporate entities.

- 313.960. Each licensed operator shall comply with all
  applicable federal, state, local laws, and regulations, including
  without limitation laws and regulations applicable to tax
  withholdings and laws and regulations applicable to providing
- 5 <u>information about winnings and the withholding to taxing</u>

calendar year, whichever is lower.

6 <u>authorities.</u>

- 313.970. 1. No fantasy sports contest operator shall offer
  any fantasy sports contest in Missouri without first being
  licensed by the commission. A fantasy sports contest operator
  wishing to offer fantasy sports contests in this state shall
  annually apply to the commission for a license and shall remit to
  the commission an annual application fee of ten thousand dollars
  or ten percent of the applicant's net revenue from the previous
  - 2. As part of the commission's investigation and licensing process, the commission may conduct an investigation of the fantasy sports contest operator's employees, officers, directors, trustees, and principal salaried executive staff officers. The applicant shall be responsible for the total cost of the investigation. If the cost of the investigation exceeds the application fee, the applicant shall remit to the commission the total cost of the investigation prior to any license being issued. The total cost of the investigation, paid by the applicant, shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars. All revenue received under this section shall be placed into the gaming commission fund created under section 313.835.
    - 3. In addition to the application fee, a licensed operator shall also pay an annual operation fee, on April fifteenth of

- 1 each year, in a sum equal to eleven and one-half percent of the
- 2 licensed operator's net revenue from the previous calendar year.
- 3 All revenue collected under this subsection shall be placed in
- 4 the gaming proceeds for education fund created under section
- 5 313.822. If a licensed operator fails to pay the annual
- 6 operation fee by April fifteenth, the licensed operator shall
- 7 <u>have its license immediately suspended by the commission until</u>
- 8 such payment is made.
- 4. Any fantasy sports contest operator already operating in
  the state prior to April 1, 2016, may operate until they have
  received or have been denied a license. Such fantasy sports
  contest operators shall apply for a license prior to October 1,
  2016. Any fantasy sports contest operator operating under this
  subsection after August 28, 2016, shall pay the annual operation
  fee of eleven and one-half percent of its net revenue from the
- 16 effective date of this section until action is taken on its
- 17 application. If a fantasy sports contest operator fails to pay
- its operation fee by April 15, 2017, the fantasy sports contest
- operator shall have its license immediately suspended by the
- 20 <u>commission</u>, or if the fantasy sports contest operator has a
- 21 pending application, its application shall be denied immediately.
- 22 <u>5. If a fantasy sports contest operator ceases to offer</u>
- fantasy sports contests in Missouri, the operator shall pay an
- 24 <u>operation fee equal to eleven and one-half percent of its net</u>
- 25 <u>revenue for the period of the calendar year in which it offered</u>
- 26 fantasy sports contests in Missouri. Such payment shall be made
- 27 within sixty days of the last day the fantasy sports contest
- operator offered fantasy sports contests in Missouri. After the

- 1 <u>expiration of sixty days</u>, a penalty of five hundred dollars per
- 2 <u>day shall be assessed against the fantasy sports contest operator</u>
- 3 until the operation fee and any penalty is paid in full.
- 4 313.990. A licensed operator shall contract annually with a
- 5 certified public accountant to perform a financial audit of the
- 6 licensed operator and the authorized internet website to ensure
- 7 compliance with sections 313.900 to 313.1020 and any rule
- 8 governing sections 313.900 to 313.1020. The licensed operator
- 9 shall pay for the audit and submit, by March first of each year,
- 10 the results of the audit to the commission.
- 11 <u>313.1000.</u> 1. Notwithstanding any applicable statutory
- 12 provision to the contrary, all investigatory, proprietary, or
- application records, information, and summaries in the possession
- of the commission or its agents may be treated by the commission
- as closed records not to be disclosed to the public; except that
- the commission shall, on written request from any person, provide
- such person with the following information furnished by an
- 18 applicant or licensee:
- 19 <u>(1) The name, business address, and business telephone</u>
- 20 number of any applicant or licensee;
- 21 (2) An identification of any applicant or licensee,
- including, if an applicant or licensee is not an individual, the
- 23 state of incorporation or registration, the corporate officers,
- and the identity of all shareholders or participants. If an
- 25 <u>applicant or licensee has a pending registration statement filed</u>
- 26 with the federal Securities and Exchange Division, the names of
- 27 those persons or entities holding interest shall be provided;
- 28 (3) An identification of any business, including, if

- 1 applicable, the state of incorporation or registration in which
  2 an applicant or licensee or an applicant's or licensee's spouse
- 3 or children have an equity interest. If an applicant or licensee
- 4 is a corporation, partnership, or other business entity, the
- 5 applicant or licensee shall identify any other corporation,
- 6 partnership, or business entity in which it has an equity
- 7 <u>interest, including, if applicable, the state of incorporation or</u>
- 8 registration. This information need not be provided by a
- 9 corporation, partnership, or other business entity that has a
- 10 pending registration statement filed with the federal Securities
- 11 and Exchange Division;
- 12 (4) Whether an applicant or licensee has been indicted,
- convicted, pleaded quilty or nolo contendere, or forfeited bail
- concerning any criminal offense under the laws of any
- jurisdiction, either felony or misdemeanor, except for traffic
- 16 violations, including the date, the name and location of the
- court, arresting agency and prosecuting agency, the case number,
- the offense, the disposition, and the location and length of
- 19 <u>incarceration;</u>
- 20 (5) Whether an applicant or licensee has had any license or
- 21 <u>certificate issued by a licensing authority in this state or any</u>
- jurisdiction denied, restricted, suspended, revoked, or not
- 23 renewed and a statement describing the facts and circumstances
- 24 concerning the denial, restriction, suspension, revocation, or
- 25 <u>nonrenewal</u>, including the licensing authority, the date each such
- 26 action was taken, and the reason for each such action;
- 27 (6) Whether an applicant or licensee has ever filed or had
- filed against it a proceeding in bankruptcy or has ever been

- 1 involved in any formal process to adjust, defer, suspend, or
- 2 otherwise work out the payment of any debt, including the date of
- 3 filing, the name and location of the court, and the case and
- 4 number of the disposition;
- 5 (7) Whether an applicant or licensee has filed or been
- 6 served with a complaint or other notice filed with any public
- 7 body regarding the delinquency in the payment of, or a dispute
- 8 over, the filings concerning the payment of any tax required
- 9 under federal, state, or local law, including the amount, type of
- 10 tax, the taxing agency, and time periods involved;
- 11 (8) A statement listing the names and titles of all public
- officials or officers of any unit of government, and relatives of
- such public officials or officers who, directly or indirectly,
- 14 own any financial interest in, have any beneficial interest in,
- are the creditors of or hold any debt instrument issued by, or
- hold or have any interest in any contractual or service
- 17 <u>relationship with, an applicant or licensee;</u>
- 18 (9) The name and business telephone number of the attorney
- 19 <u>representing an applicant or licensee in matters before the</u>
- 20 commission.
- 2. Notwithstanding any applicable statutory provision to
- the contrary, the commission shall, on written request from any
- 23 person, also provide the following information:
- 24 (1) The amount of the tax receipts paid to the state by the
- 25 holder of a license;
- 26 (2) Whenever the commission finds an applicant for a
- 27 license unsuitable for licensing, a copy of the written letter
- outlining the reasons for the denial; and

- 1 (3) Whenever the commission has refused to grant leave for
  2 an applicant to withdraw his application, a copy of the letter
  3 outlining the reasons for the refusal.
- 313.1010. The commission shall have full jurisdiction over
  and shall supervise all licensed operators, other licensees, and
  authorized internet websites governed by sections 313.900 to
  313.1020. The commission shall have the following powers to
- 9 <u>(1) To investigate applicants;</u>

implement sections 313.900 to 313.1020:

- 10 <u>(2) To license fantasy sports contest operators and adopt</u>
  11 <u>standards for licensing;</u>
- 12 (3) To investigate alleged violations of sections 313.900

  to 313.1020 or the commission's rules, orders, or final

  decisions;
  - (4) To assess an appropriate administrative penalty of not more than ten thousand dollars per violation, not to exceed one-hundred thousand dollars for violations arising out of the same transaction or occurrence, and take action including, but not limited to, the suspension or revocation of a license for violations of sections 313.900 to 313.1020 or the commission's rules, orders, or final decisions;
  - (5) To issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses and subpoenas duces tecum for the production of books, records, and other pertinent documents, and to administer oaths and affirmations to the witnesses, when, in the judgment of the commission, it is necessary to enforce sections 313.900 to 313.1020 or the commission rules;
    - (6) To take any other action as may be reasonable or

1	appropriate to enforce sections 313.900 to 313.1020 and the
2	commission rules.
3	313.1020. 1. The commission shall have power to adopt and
4	enforce rules and regulations:
5	(1) To regulate and license the management, operation, and
6	conduct of fantasy sports contests and participants therein;
7	(2) To adopt responsible play protections for registered
8	players; and
9	(3) To properly administer and enforce the provisions of
10	sections 313.900 to 313.1020.
11	2. The commission shall not adopt rules or regulations
12	limiting or regulating the rules or administration of an
13	individual fantasy sports contest, the statistical makeup of a
14	fantasy sports contest, or the digital platform of a fantasy
15	sports contest operator.
16	3. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated under the
17	authority of sections 313.900 to 313.1020 shall become effective
18	unless it has been promulgated pursuant to the provisions of

section 536.024.
