## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 270

1	Whereas, the tenth amendment to the United States
2	Constitution reserves for the States or people all rights not
3	delegated to the federal government; and
4	Whereas, the Constitution of the United States does not
5	delegate authority to the federal government to create
6	identification standards, nor to condition the full faith and
7	credit owed to a State's acts, records, and proceedings; and
8	Whereas, identification documents have traditionally and
9	historically been the province of the several States; and
10	Whereas, the REAL ID Act increases the administrative burden
11	on the States, and will result in increased expense for license
12	and identification card applicants, as well as extended waiting
13	and processing times; and
14	Whereas, history has shown that all governments, even our
15	own, present a hazard of overreach and tyranny; and
16	Whereas, in 2009, the Missouri General Assembly passed
17	legislation, signed by Governor Nixon, expressly forbidding the
18	state from cooperating with the REAL ID Act; and
19	Whereas, in 2013, the Missouri General Assembly passed
20	legislation, signed by Governor Nixon, clearly prohibiting the
21	Department of Revenue from retaining source documents as required
22	by the REAL ID Act; and

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Whereas, in 2014, the people of Missouri passed Amendment 9

to ensure their personal privacy is not violated by our 1 2 government; and 3 Whereas, the people of Missouri have made it abundantly 4 clear that they value their privacy and refuse to sacrifice it 5 under the guise of security; and 6 Whereas, implementation of the REAL ID Act will put in place 7 a system that may further enable a surveillance state; and 8 Whereas, the brave men and women of our armed forces put 9 their lives on the line, and sometimes make the ultimate 10 sacrifice, to defend our freedom and liberty: Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the members of the 11 12 Missouri Senate, Ninety-ninth General Assembly, First Regular 13 Session, hereby urge that the United States Congress repeal the 14 REAL ID Act of 2005; and 15 Be It Further Resolved that the Secretary of the Missouri 16 Senate be instructed to prepare properly inscribed copies of this resolution for each member of Missouri's Congressional 17

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delegation.
