AN ACT

To amend chapter 84, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to airport police officers in certain cities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 84, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 84.1000, to read as follows:

84.1000. 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 84.770 to the contrary, in any home rule city with more than four hundred thousand inhabitants and located in more than one county, the city may appoint and employ as many airport police officers as it may deem necessary to protect persons and property, and to preserve peace and good order in the public buildings, properties, grounds, and other 7 facilities located within the boundaries of its airports. The city may authorize airport police officers to carry firearms approved by the city, wear uniforms and badges approved by the city, enforce city ordinance 10 and state statute violations upon the public streets within the boundaries of the airports in the city, create and maintain records in 11 12 conjunction with the police force organized under section 84.470, and 13 perform such other duties and exercise such other powers within 14 airport boundaries not inconsistent with the provisions of section 84.350 to 84.860 as shall further the efficient and economical operation 16 of the airport police. Within the boundaries of the city's airports, airport police, city police, and the sheriff of the county in which the 1718 airport is located shall cooperate in all aspects of preserving the public 19 peace, preventing crime, arresting offenders, protecting the rights of 20 persons and property, guarding the public health, preserving public order, preventing and removing nuisances, providing a proper police

force at fires for the protection of firefighters and property, protecting transients, and seeing that all state statutes and city ordinances are 24enforced on airport property and on public streets within the 25boundaries of the airports.

2. The airport police officers, before they enter upon their duties, shall take and subscribe an oath of office before some officer authorized to administer oaths, to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of their office, which oath shall be filed in the office of the city clerk, and the city shall give each airport police officer so appointed and qualified a certificate of appointment, under the seal of the city, which certificate shall empower him or her with the same authority to maintain order, preserve peace, and make arrest within the boundaries of the city's airports as is now held by peace officers 34within their respective jurisdictions. The airport police officer may, in addition, expel from the public buildings, properties, grounds, and other facilities within the boundaries of the city's airports, persons 38 violating the rules and regulations that may be prescribed by the city or others under the authority of the city. Such airport police officers shall have satisfactorily completed before appointment a training course for police officers as prescribed by chapter 590 for state peace 41 officers or shall otherwise comply with the requirements of chapter 590 43 for certification within the time periods specified in such chapter.
