AN ACT

To repeal section 302.188, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to veteran designations on driver's licenses and identification cards.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 302.188, RSMo, is repealed and one new section
2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 302.188, to read as follows:

302.188. 1. A person may apply to the department of revenue to obtain
2 a veteran designation on a driver's license or identification card issued under this
3 chapter by providing:

4 (1) A United States Department of Defense discharge document,
5 otherwise known as a DD Form 214, that shows a discharge status of "honorable"
6 or "general under honorable conditions" that establishes the person's service in
7 the Armed Forces of the United States; or

8 (2) A United States Uniformed Services Identification Card, otherwise
9 known as a DD Form 2, that includes a discharge status of "retired" or "reserve
10 retired" establishing the person's service in the Armed Forces of the United
11 States; [and] or

12 (3) **An Army or Air National Guard NGB Form 22 that shows a**
13 **discharge status of "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions";**
14 **or**

15 (4) **A United States Department of Veterans Affairs photo**
16 **identification card; or**

17 (5) **A World War II discharge document WD AGO form, NavPers**
18 **form, NavMC form, or NavCG form that shows a discharge status of**
19 **"honorable" or "general under honorable conditions"; or**

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

20 **(6) Any other official form or discharge document establishing**
21 **the applicant has served in the United States Armed Forces and**
22 **received a character of service rating other than "dishonorable", "bad**
23 **conduct discharge", or "dismissed"; and**

24 **(7) Payment of the fee for the driver's license or identification card**
25 **authorized under this chapter.**

26 2. If the person is seeking a duplicate driver's license with the veteran
27 designation and his or her driver's license has not expired, the fee shall be as
28 provided under section 302.185.

29 3. The department of revenue may determine the appropriate placement
30 of the veteran designation on the driver's licenses and identification cards
31 authorized under this section and may promulgate the necessary rules for
32 administration of this section.

33 4. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010,
34 that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective
35 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and
36 if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and
37 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to
38 review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are
39 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and
40 any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void.
