AN ACT

To amend chapter 455, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to domestic violence fatality review panels.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 455, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 455.560, to read as follows:

455.560. 1. The prosecuting attorney or the circuit attorney may

- 2 impanel a domestic violence fatality review panel for the county or city
- 3 not within a county in which he or she serves to investigate the deaths
- 4 of victims of homicides determined to be related to domestic violence
- 5 as the term is defined in section 455.010. The panel shall be formed by
- 6 the department of social services.
- 7 2. The panel may include any representative of programs or
- 8 organizations that provide services and responses to victims of
- 9 domestic violence within the county or city not within a county. The
- 10 panel shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:
- 11 (1) The prosecuting or circuit attorney;
- 12 (2) The coroner or medical examiner for the county or city not 13 within a county;
- 14 (3) Law enforcement personnel in the county or city not within 15 a county;
- 16 (4) A representative of the department of social services;
- 17 (5) A provider of public health care services;
- 18 (6) A representative of the local office of the department of 19 public safety;
- 20 (7) A provider of emergency medical services or other medical 21 or health care providers;

- 22 (8) A representative of any victim assistant unit for the 23 prosecuting or circuit attorney, law enforcement organization, or court 24of the county or city not within a county;
 - (9) Representatives of domestic violence shelters, as defined in 455.220, and domestic violence services organizations that provide services for victims within the county or city not within a county;
 - (10) Representatives of sexual assault centers and sexual assault services organizations, as defined in 455.003, that provide sexual assault services for victims within the county or city not within a county.
- 32 3. The prosecuting or circuit attorney shall organize the panel and shall call the first organizational meeting of the panel. The panel 33 shall elect a chairman who shall convene the panel to meet to review 34 all deaths of victims of homicides determined to be related to domestic 35 violence. In addition, the panel may review at its own discretion any 36 37 homicide reported to it by the medical examiner or coroner, even if it does not meet criteria for review as set forth by the department. The 38 panel shall issue a final report, which shall be a public record, of each 39 investigation, its findings and recommendations for enhanced 40 practices, protocols, and collaborations to address domestic violence 41 and prevent homicides, to the governor, the speaker of the house of 42representatives, the president pro tempore of the senate, the executive 44 leadership of the government of the political subdivision of the state of 45 Missouri in which the panel operates, and the statewide domestic 46 violence coalition, as such is recognized by the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of Health and 47Human Services. The final report shall include a summary. The 48 department of health and senior services shall analyze the domestic 49 50 violence fatality review panel reports and periodically prepare reports which describe the incidence, causes, location, and other factors 52 pertaining to domestic violence fatalities.
 - 4. The domestic violence fatality review panel shall enjoy such official immunity as exists at common law.
 - 5. Work products of the domestic violence fatality review panel other than the final report required by subsection 3 of this section, including, but not limited to internal memoranda, summaries or minutes of panel meetings, and written, audio recorded, or electronic

records and communications, are not public records as defined by subdivision (6) of section 610.010 and are not available for public examination, reproduction, or disclosure, and are not admissible as evidence in any civil, criminal, or administrative proceeding.

6. The executive officer of any municipality or county may request that a domestic violence fatality review panel be convened in response to any fatality which occurs within the boundaries of the 66 municipality or county.
