## AN ACT

To repeal section 49.060, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to vacancies in the office of county commissioner, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 49.060, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 49.060, to read as follows:

- 49.060. **1.** When a vacancy shall occur in the office of a county 2 commissioner, the vacancy shall at once be certified by the clerk of the 3 commission to the governor[, who shall fill such vacancy with a person who
- 2. If at the time the vacancy occurs there is less than one year remaining in the unexpired term, the vacancy shall be filled as provided in section 105.030.

resides in the district at the time the vacancy occurs, as provided by law.

- 3. If at the time the vacancy occurs there is one year or more remaining in the unexpired term, it shall be the duty of the governor
- 10 to fill such vacancy by appointing, by and with the advice and consent
- 11 of the senate subject to the provisions of article IV, section 51 of the
- 12 Missouri constitution, some eligible person to said office who shall
- 13 discharge the duties thereof until the next general election, at which
- 14 time a commissioner shall be chosen for the remainder of the term, who
- 15 shall hold such office until a successor is duly elected and qualified,
- 16 unless sooner removed.

4. This section shall not apply to any county which has adopted a charter for its own government under article VI, section 18 of the Missouri constitution.

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to ensure that all vacant public offices are filled in a timely manner, the enactment of section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the enactment of section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
