

SENATE SUBSTITUTE
FOR
SENATE BILL NO. 881

AN ACT

To repeal sections 301.074, 301.075, and 301.145, RSMo,
and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections
relating to special license plates.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI,
AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section A. Sections 301.074, 301.075, and 301.145, RSMo,
2 are repealed and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to
3 be known as sections 301.074, 301.075, and 301.145, to read as
4 follows:

5 301.074. License plates issued under sections 301.071 to
6 301.075 shall be valid for the duration of the veteran's
7 disability. Each such applicant issued license plates under
8 these provisions shall annually furnish proof of vehicle
9 inspection and proof of disability to the director, except that
10 an applicant whose service connected disability qualifying him
11 for special license plates consists in whole or in part of loss
12 of an eye or a limb or an applicant with a one hundred percent
13 permanent disability, as established by a physician's signed
14 statement to that effect, need only furnish proof of disability
15 to the director when initially applying for the special license
16 plates and not thereafter, but in such case proof that the
17 veteran is alive shall be required annually. [Each person
18 qualifying under sections 301.071 to 301.075 may license only one

1 motor vehicle under these provisions.] No commercial motor
2 vehicle in excess of twenty-four thousand pounds gross weight may
3 be licensed under the provisions of sections 301.071 to 301.075.

4 301.075. There shall be no fee charged for one set of
5 license plates issued to an eligible person under the provisions
6 of [this] sections 301.071 to 301.075. A second or subsequent
7 set of license plates issued to the eligible person under these
8 sections shall be subject to regular registration fees and the
9 fee required for personalized license plates under section
10 301.144.

11 301.145. Any person who has been awarded the Congressional
12 Medal of Honor may apply for special motor vehicle license plates
13 for any vehicle he or she owns, either solely or jointly, other
14 than commercial vehicles weighing over twenty-four thousand
15 pounds, as provided in this section. Any such person shall make
16 application for the special license plates on a form provided by
17 the director of revenue and furnish such proof of receipt of the
18 Congressional Medal of Honor as the director may require. The
19 director shall then issue license plates bearing the words
20 "CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR" in a [form] manner prescribed by
21 the [advisory committee established in section 301.129, except
22 that] director of revenue. Such license plates shall be made
23 with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and
24 design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be
25 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.
26 There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any
27 person qualified under this section may obtain so long as each
28 set of license plates issued under this section is issued for

1 vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person. License plates
2 issued under this section shall not be transferable to any other
3 person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle
4 may operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year
5 licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

6 There shall be no fee charged in addition to regular registration
7 fees for license plates issued under this section.
