6. The agencies for which law enforcement officials approved under this section shall be subject to periodic program reviews and be required to submit a commercial vehicle safety plan that is consistent with and incorporated into the statewide enforcement plan.

9 Beginning January 1, 2009, no local law enforcement 7. 10 officer may conduct a random commercial motor vehicle roadside 11 inspection to determine compliance with the provisions of 12 sections 304.170 to 304.230 unless the law enforcement officer 13 has satisfactorily completed, as a part of his or her training, 14 the basic course of instruction developed by the commercial 15 vehicle safety alliance and has been approved by the Missouri 16 state highway patrol under this section. Law enforcement 17 officers authorized to enforce the provisions of sections 304.170 18 to 304.230 shall annually receive in-service training related to 19 commercial motor vehicle operations, including but not limited to 20 training in current federal motor carrier safety regulations, safety inspection procedures, and out-of-service criteria. The 21 22 annual training requirements shall be approved by the 23 superintendent of the state highway patrol.

8. Law enforcement officers who have received commercial vehicle safety alliance certification prior to January 1, 2009, shall be exempt from the provisions of this section and such officers shall be qualified to conduct random roadside inspections described under this section and section 304.230.

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9. <u>No safety inspection shall be performed on the shoulder</u>

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1 of any highway with a posted speed limit in excess of forty miles
2 per hour.

3 10. The superintendent of the state highway patrol shall 4 promulgate rules and regulations necessary to administer the 5 certification procedures and any other provisions of this 6 section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined 7 in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated 8 in this section shall become effective only if it complies with 9 and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are 10 11 nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the 12 13 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 14 15 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2008, 16 shall be invalid and void."; and
