AN ACT

To repeal sections 335.016, 335.019, 335.046, 335.056, and 335.086, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof six new sections relating to advanced practice registered nurses.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 335.016, 335.019, 335.046, 335.056, and 335.086,

- 2 RSMo, are repealed and six new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as
- 3 sections 335.016, 335.018, 335.019, 335.046, 335.056, and 335.086, to read as
- 4 follows:
 - 335.016. As used in this chapter, unless the context clearly requires
- 2 otherwise, the following words and terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Accredited", the official authorization or status granted by an agency
- for a program through a voluntary process;
- 5 (2) "Advanced practice registered nurse" or "APRN", a [nurse who has
- 6 education beyond the basic nursing education and is certified by a nationally
- 7 recognized professional organization as a certified nurse practitioner, certified
- 8 nurse midwife, certified registered nurse anesthetist, or a certified clinical nurse
- 9 specialist. The board shall promulgate rules specifying which nationally
- 10 recognized professional organization certifications are to be recognized for the
- 11 purposes of this section. Advanced practice nurses and only such individuals may
- 12 use the title "Advanced Practice Registered Nurse" and the abbreviation "APRN"]
- 13 person who is licensed under the provisions of this chapter to engage
- 14 in the practice of advanced practice nursing in one of the four APRN
- 15 roles recognized in this section;
- 16 (3) "Approval", official recognition of nursing education programs which

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- 17 meet standards established by the board of nursing;
- 18 (4) "Board" or "state board", the state board of nursing;
- 19 (5) "Certified clinical nurse specialist", a registered nurse who is currently 20 certified as a clinical nurse specialist by a nationally recognized certifying board 21 approved by the board of nursing. A certified clinical nurse specialist is 22 one of the four APRN roles;
- 23 (6) "Certified nurse midwife", a registered nurse who is currently certified 24 as a nurse midwife by the American College of Nurse Midwives, or other 25 nationally recognized certifying body approved by the board of nursing. A 26 certified nurse midwife is one of the four APRN roles;
- 27 (7) "Certified nurse practitioner", a registered nurse who is currently 28 certified as a nurse practitioner by a nationally recognized certifying body 29 approved by the board of nursing. A certified nurse practitioner is one of 30 the four APRN roles:
- 31 (8) "Certified registered nurse anesthetist", a registered nurse who is 32 currently certified as a nurse anesthetist by the [Council on Certification of 33 Nurse Anesthetists, the Council on Recertification of Nurse Anesthetists,] 34 National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse 35 Anesthetists or other nationally recognized certifying body approved by the 36 board of nursing. A certified registered nurse anesthetist is one of the 37 four APRN roles;
 - (9) "Collaborative agreement", a written mutual agreement between an APRN licensee who has not met the required two years of advanced practice nursing experience and a physician or an advanced practice registered nurse with more than two years of experience licensed under this chapter;
- (10) "Executive director", a qualified individual employed by the board as executive secretary or otherwise to administer the provisions of this chapter under the board's direction. Such person employed as executive director shall not be a member of the board;
- 47 [(10)] (11) "Inactive nurse", as defined by rule pursuant to section 48 335.061;
- 49 [(11)] (12) "Lapsed license status", as defined by rule under section 50 335.061;
- [(12)] (13) "Licensed practical nurse" or "practical nurse", a person licensed pursuant to the provisions of this chapter to engage in the practice of

- 53 practical nursing;
- [(13)] (14) "Licensure", the issuing of a license to an individual authorizing the individual to practice advanced practice, professional, or practical nursing to candidates who have met the specified requirements and the recording of the names of those persons as holders of a license to practice advanced practice, professional, or practical nursing;
- [(14)] (15) "Population focus", one of the following six areas of practice for which an advanced practice registered nurse has the education and training to provide care and services:
 - (a) A family or individual across the lifespan;
- 63 (b) Adult-gerontology;
- 64 (c) Pediatrics;

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- 65 (d) Neonatal;
- 66 (e) Women's health or gender-related; and
- 67 (f) Psychiatric or mental health;
- 68 (16) "Practice of advanced practice nursing":
- 69 (a) The practice of advanced practice nursing that includes, but 70 is not limited to:
- a. The practice of professional nursing as defined in this section performed with or without compensation or personal profit;
- b. Conducting an advanced assessment beyond a registered nurse's assessment;
 - c. Ordering and interpreting diagnostic procedures;
- 76 d. Establishing primary and differential diagnoses;
- e. Prescribing, ordering, administering, dispensing, and furnishing therapeutic measures, including the authority to:
- 79 (i) Diagnose, prescribe, and institute therapy or referrals of 80 patients to health care agencies, health care providers, and community 81 resources;
- 82 (ii) Prescribe, order, procure, administer, dispense, and furnish 83 pharmacological agents, including over the counter and legend drugs;
- (iii) Prescribe, order, procure, administer, dispense, and furnish controlled substances listed in Schedules III, IV, and V of section 195.017, and Schedule II hydrocodone with a certificate of controlled substance prescriptive authority as part of a collaborative practice arrangement; and
 - (iv) Plan and initiate a therapeutic regimen that includes

- 90 ordering and prescribing nonpharmacological interventions including,
- 91 but not limited to, durable medical equipment, medical devices,
- 92 nutrition, blood and blood products, and diagnostic and supportive
- 93 services including, but not limited to, home health care, hospice, and
- 94 physical and occupational therapy;
- 95 f. Delegating and assigning the performance of therapeutic 96 measures to assistive personnel;
- 97 g. Consulting with other disciplines and providing referrals to 98 health care agencies, health care providers, and community resources; 99 and
- h. Other acts that require education and training consistent with professional standards and commensurate with the APRN's education, certification, demonstrated competencies, and experience;
 - (b) Advanced practice nursing shall be practiced in accordance with the APRN's graduate-level education and certification in one of four recognized roles, with at least one population focus, including a:
- a. Certified clinical nurse specialist;
- b. Certified nurse midwife;

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- c. Certified nurse practitioner; and
- d. Certified registered nurse anesthetist;
- 110 (c) When providing direct patient care, an APRN shall wear 111 identification that clearly identifies the nurse as an APRN, unless 112 wearing identification creates a safety or health risk for either the 113 nurse or the patient;
- 114 (d) Nothing in this subdivision shall alter the definition of the 115 practice of professional nursing;
- 116 (17) "Practice of practical nursing", the performance for compensation of selected acts for the promotion of health and in the care of persons who are ill, 117 injured, or experiencing alterations in normal health processes. Such 118 performance requires substantial specialized skill, judgment, and knowledge. All 119 120 such nursing care shall be given under the direction of a person licensed by a state regulatory board to prescribe medications and treatments or under the 121 122direction of a registered professional nurse. For the purposes of this chapter, the term "direction" shall mean guidance or [supervision] oversight provided by a 123 person licensed by a state regulatory board to prescribe medications and 124125 treatments or a registered professional nurse, including, but not limited to, oral, 126 written, or otherwise communicated orders or directives for patient care. When

127 practical nursing care is delivered pursuant to the direction of a person licensed

- 128 by a state regulatory board to prescribe medications and treatments or under the
- 129 direction of a registered professional nurse, such care may be delivered by a
- 130 licensed practical nurse without direct physical oversight;
- [(15)] (18) "Practice of professional nursing", the performance for
- 132 compensation of any act or function which requires substantial specialized
- 133 education, judgment, and skill based on knowledge and application of principles
- derived from the biological, physical, social, behavioral, and nursing sciences,
- 135 including, but not limited to:
- 136 (a) Responsibility for the **promotion and** teaching of health care and the
- 137 prevention of illness to the patient and his or her family;
- (b) Assessment, data collection, nursing diagnosis, nursing care,
- 139 evaluation, and counsel of persons who are ill, injured, or experiencing
- 140 alterations in normal health processes;
- 141 (c) The administration of medications and treatments as prescribed by a
- 142 person licensed by a state regulatory board to prescribe medications and
- 143 treatments;
- (d) The coordination, **initiation**, **performance**, and assistance in the
- 145 **determination and** delivery of a plan of health care with all members of a
- 146 health team;
- (e) The teaching and supervision of other persons in the performance of
- 148 any of the foregoing;
- [(16)] (19) A "registered professional nurse" or "registered nurse", a
- 150 person licensed pursuant to the provisions of this chapter to engage in the
- 151 practice of professional nursing;
- [(17)] (20) "Retired license status", any person licensed in this state
- 153 under this chapter who retires from such practice. Such person shall file with the
- 154 board an affidavit, on a form to be furnished by the board, which states the date
- 155 on which the licensee retired from such practice, an intent to retire from the
- 156 practice for at least two years, and such other facts as tend to verify the
- 157 retirement as the board may deem necessary; but if the licensee thereafter
- 158 reengages in the practice, the licensee shall renew his or her license with the
- 159 board as provided by this chapter and by rule and regulation.

335.018. An advanced practice registered nurse that has:

2 (1) Been issued a license under section 335.046 or an advanced

3 practice registered nurse license under section 335.016;

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4 (2) Passed any examination, written or oral, or both, which the 5 board may require;

- (3) Maintained such license for a period of two years; and
- 7 (4) Engaged in the practice of advanced practice nursing in collaboration with a physician under section 334.104, for a period of not less than two years may thereafter upon notice, with evidence of completion of the requirements in subdivisions (1) to (4) of this section 10 to the board, practice advanced practice nursing without a 11 12 collaborative agreement.
 - 335.019. 1. An advanced practice registered nurse's prescriptive authority shall include authority to:
- 3 (1) Prescribe, dispense, and administer nonscheduled legend drugs and medications as defined under section 338.330 within such APRN's practice and specialty; and
- 6 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, receive, prescribe, administer, and provide nonscheduled legend drug samples from pharmaceutical manufacturers to patients at no charge to the patient or any other party.
- 10 2. The board of nursing may grant a certificate of controlled substance 11 prescriptive authority to an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined in 12 **section 335.016,** who[:
- 13 (1)] submits proof of successful completion of an advanced pharmacology course that shall include [preceptorial experience in] the prescription of drugs, 14 medicines, and therapeutic devices[; and 15
- 16 (2) Provides documentation of a minimum of three hundred clock hours 17 preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and therapeutic devices with a qualified preceptor; and 18
- (3) Provides evidence of a minimum of one thousand hours of practice in an advanced practice nursing category prior to application for a certificate of 21prescriptive authority. The one thousand hours shall not include clinical hours 22 obtained in the advanced practice nursing education program. The one thousand 23hours of practice in an advanced practice nursing category may include 24transmitting a prescription order orally or telephonically or to an inpatient medical record from protocols developed in collaboration with and signed by a licensed physician; and
- 27 (4) Has a controlled substance prescribing authority delegated in the

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collaborative practice arrangement under section 334.104 with a physician who has an unrestricted federal Drug Enforcement Administration registration number and who is actively engaged in a practice comparable in scope, specialty, or expertise to that of the advanced practice registered nursel.

- 3. The board of nursing may grant a certificate of controlled substance prescriptive authority to an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined under section 335.016, to administer, dispense, or prescribe controlled substances listed in Schedules III, IV, and V of section 195.017, and Schedule II hydrocodone within the parameters of a collaborative practice arrangement; except that, such certificate shall not delegate the authority to administer any controlled substances listed in Schedules III, IV, and V of section 195.017, or Schedule II hydrocodone for the purpose of inducing sedation or general anesthesia for therapeutic, diagnostic, or surgical procedures.
- 4. Advanced practice registered nurses, except for certified registered nurse anesthetists, shall not administer any controlled substances listed in Schedules III, IV, and V of section 195.017, or Schedule II hydrocodone for the purpose of inducing general anesthesia for procedures that are outside the advanced practice registered nurse's scope of practice.

335.046. 1. An applicant for a license to practice as a registered professional nurse shall submit to the board a written application on forms 3 furnished to the applicant. The original application shall contain the applicant's statements showing the applicant's education and other such pertinent information as the board may require. The applicant shall be of good moral character and have completed at least the high school course of study, or the equivalent thereof as determined by the state board of education, and have 7 successfully completed the basic professional curriculum in an accredited or approved school of nursing and earned a professional nursing degree or 10 diploma. Each application shall contain a statement that it is made under oath 11 or affirmation and that its representations are true and correct to the best 12knowledge and belief of the person signing same, subject to the penalties of making a false affidavit or declaration. Applicants from non-English-speaking lands shall be required to submit evidence of proficiency in the English language. The applicant [must] shall be approved by the board and shall pass 15 an examination as required by the board. The board may require by rule as a 16

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requirement for licensure that each applicant shall pass an oral or practical examination. Upon successfully passing the examination, the board may issue 19 to the applicant a license to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse. The applicant for a license to practice registered professional nursing 20 shall pay a license fee in such amount as set by the board. The fee shall be 2122 uniform for all applicants. Applicants from foreign countries shall be licensed as 23 prescribed by rule.

- 2. An applicant for license to practice as a licensed practical nurse shall submit to the board a written application on forms furnished to the applicant. The original application shall contain the applicant's statements showing the applicant's education and other such pertinent information as the 28board may require. Such applicant shall be of good moral character, and have 29 completed at least two years of high school, or its equivalent as established by the state board of education, and have successfully completed a basic prescribed 30 31 curriculum in a state-accredited or approved school of nursing, earned a nursing degree, certificate or diploma and completed a course approved by the board on 3233 the role of the practical nurse. Each application shall contain a statement that it is made under oath or affirmation and that its representations are true and 34 correct to the best knowledge and belief of the person signing same, subject to the penalties of making a false affidavit or declaration. Applicants from 36 non-English-speaking countries shall be required to submit evidence of their proficiency in the English language. The applicant [must] shall be approved by 39 the board and shall pass an examination as required by the board. The board 40 may require by rule as a requirement for licensure that each applicant shall pass an oral or practical examination. Upon successfully passing the examination, the board may issue to the applicant a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse. The applicant for a license to practice licensed practical nursing shall pay a fee in such amount as may be set by the board. The fee shall be uniform for all applicants. Applicants from foreign countries shall be licensed as prescribed by rule.
 - 3. (1) An applicant for a license to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse shall submit a completed application as established by the board. The application shall, at a minimum, contain:
- 50 (a) The applicant's advanced nursing education and other 51 pertinent information as the board may require;
 - (b) A statement under oath or affirmation that the applicant is

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of good moral character and that the representations contained in the application are true and correct to the best knowledge and belief of the applicant, subject to the penalties of making a false affidavit or declaration;

- 57 (c) Documentation that demonstrates the following educational 58 requirements:
- a. Prior to July 1, 1998, completion of a formal post-basic 60 educational program from or formally affiliated with an accredited 61 college, university, or hospital of at least one academic year, which 62 includes advanced nurse theory and clinical nursing practice, leading 63 to a graduate degree or certificate with a concentration in an advanced 64 nursing clinical specialty area;
 - b. From July 1, 1998, to June 30, 2009, completion of a graduate degree from an accredited college or university with a concentration in an advanced practice nursing clinical specialty area, which includes advanced nursing theory and clinical nursing practice;
- 69 c. On or after July 1, 2009, completion of an accredited graduate-70 level advanced practice registered nursing program that prepared the 71 applicant for one of the four APRN roles in at least one population 72 focus;
 - (d) Documentation of current certification in one of the four APRN roles from a nationally recognized certifying body approved by the board, or current documentation of recognition as an advanced practice registered nurse issued by the board prior to January 1, 2018; and
- (e) Other evidence as required by board rule, including, as may be applicable, evidence of proficiency in the English language.
 - (2) The applicant for a license to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse shall pay a license fee in such amount as set by the board that shall be uniform for all such applicants.
 - (3) Upon issuance of a license, the license holder's advanced practice registered nursing license and his or her professional nursing license shall be treated as one license for the purpose of renewal and assessment of renewal fees.
- 4. Upon refusal of the board to allow any applicant to sit for either the registered professional nurses' examination or the licensed practical nurses' examination, as the case may be, the board shall comply with the provisions of

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- 90 section 621.120 and advise the applicant of his or her right to have a hearing
- before the administrative hearing commission. The administrative hearing
- commission shall hear complaints taken pursuant to section 621.120. 92
- 93 [4.] 5. The board shall not deny a license because of sex, religion, race,
- 94 ethnic origin, age or political affiliation.

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335.056. The license of every person licensed under the provisions of [sections 335.011 to 335.096] this chapter shall be renewed as provided. An application for renewal of license shall be mailed to every person to whom a license was issued or renewed during the current licensing period. The applicant shall complete the application and return it to the board by the renewal date with a renewal fee in an amount to be set by the board. The fee shall be uniform for all applicants. The certificates of renewal shall render the holder thereof a legal practitioner of nursing for the period stated in the certificate of renewal. Any person who practices nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse, as 9 10 a registered professional nurse, or as a licensed practical nurse during the time his or her license has lapsed shall be considered an illegal practitioner and shall 11 12 be subject to the penalties provided for violation of the provisions of [sections 335.011 to 335.096] this chapter. 13

335.086. No person, firm, corporation, or association shall:

- 2 (1) Sell or attempt to sell or fraudulently obtain or furnish or attempt to 3 furnish any nursing diploma, license, renewal, or record or aid or abet therein;
- (2) Practice [professional or practical] nursing as defined [by sections 4 335.011 to 335.096 in this chapter under cover of any diploma, license, or 5 record illegally or fraudulently obtained or signed or issued unlawfully or under 7 fraudulent representation;
- 8 (3) Practice [professional nursing or practical] nursing as defined [by sections 335.011 to 335.096] in this chapter unless duly licensed to do so under the provisions of [sections 335.011 to 335.096] this chapter;
- 11 (4) Use in connection with his **or her** name any designation tending to 12 imply that he or she is a licensed advanced practice registered nurse, a licensed registered professional nurse, or a licensed practical nurse unless duly 13 licensed so to practice under the provisions of [sections 335.011 to 335.096] this 14 15 chapter;
- (5) Practice advanced practice nursing, professional nursing, or 16 17 practical nursing during the time his or her license issued under the provisions of [sections 335.011 to 335.096] this chapter shall be suspended or revoked; or

19 (6) Conduct a nursing education program for the preparation of 20 professional or practical nurses unless the program has been accredited by the 21 board.

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
