AN ACT

To repeal section 34.165, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to state bidding for certain entities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 34.165, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 34.165, to read as follows:

34.165. 1. In making purchases for this state, its governmental agencies

2 or political subdivisions, the commissioner of administration shall give a bidding

By preference consisting of at least a [ten-point] five-point bonus and no

greater than a fifteen-point bonus on bids for products and services

5 manufactured, produced or assembled in qualified nonprofit organizations for the

6 blind established pursuant to the provisions of 41 U.S.C. Sections 46 to 48c, as

7 amended and in sheltered workshops holding a certificate of approval from the

8 department of elementary and secondary education pursuant to section 178.920

9 if, at a minimum, the participating nonprofit organization or workshop

10 provides the greater of two percent or five thousand dollars of the total contract

value of bids for purchase not exceeding ten million dollars. The bonus points

12 shall be awarded on the basis of a sliding scale, as determined in rule

13 by the commissioner of administration, based on revenue generation

14 for and utilization of qualified nonprofit organizations for the blind or

15 sheltered workshops, with the bonus points increasing as the revenue

generation for and utilization of such organizations and workshops

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20 agency by the contractor at the completion of the contract or within thirty days 21 of the first anniversary of the contract, whichever first occurs, verifying 22 compliance.

- 3. The commissioner of administration shall make such rules and regulations regarding specifications, quality standards, time of delivery, performance, **bidding preferences**, and other relevant matters as shall be necessary to carry out the purpose of this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the authority of this section shall become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to the provisions of section 536.024.
- 4. At the request of the commissioner of administration, the state auditor may examine all records, books and data of any qualified nonprofit organization for the blind to determine the costs of manufacturing products or rendering services and the manner and efficiency of production and administration of such nonprofit organization with relation to any product or services purchased by this state, its governmental agencies or political subdivisions and to furnish the results of such examination to the commissioner for appropriate action.

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
