"171.031. 1. Each school board shall prepare annually a 4 calendar for the school term, specifying the opening date, days 5 of planned attendance, and providing a minimum term of at least 6 7 one hundred seventy-four days for schools with a five-day school 8 week or one hundred forty-two days for schools with a four-day 9 school week, and one thousand forty-four hours of actual pupil 10 attendance. In school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, one 11 thousand forty-four hours of actual pupil attendance shall be 12 required for the school term with no minimum number of school 13 days. In addition, such calendar shall include six make-up days 14 for possible loss of attendance due to inclement weather as 15 defined in subsection 1 of section 171.033. In school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, such calendar shall include 16 17 thirty-six make-up hours for possible loss of attendance due to 18 inclement weather, as defined in subsection 1 of section 171.033, with no minimum number of make-up days. 19

20 2. Each local school district may set its opening date each 21 year, which date shall be no earlier than [ten] <u>fourteen</u> calendar 22 days prior to the first Monday in September. No public school 23 district shall select an earlier start date unless, <u>for calendars</u> for school years before school year 2020-21, the district follows the procedure set forth in subsection 3 of this section. The procedure set forth in subsection 3 of this section shall be unavailable to school districts in preparing their calendars for school year 2020-21 and for subsequent years.

6 For calendars for school years before school year 2020-3. 7 21, a district may set an opening date that is more than [ten] fourteen calendar days prior to the first Monday in September 8 9 only if the local school board first gives public notice of a public meeting to discuss the proposal of opening school on a 10 11 date more than [ten] fourteen days prior to the first Monday in September, and the local school board holds said meeting and, at 12 13 the same public meeting, a majority of the board votes to allow 14 an earlier opening date. If all of the previous conditions are 15 met, the district may set its opening date more than [ten] fourteen calendar days prior to the first Monday in September. 16 17 The condition provided in this subsection must be satisfied by 18 the local school board each year that the board proposes an 19 opening date more than [ten] fourteen days before the first 20 Monday in September.

4. If any local district violates the provisions of this section, the department of elementary and secondary education shall withhold an amount equal to one quarter of the state funding the district generated under section 163.031 for each date the district was in violation of this section.

5. The provisions of subsections 2 to 4 of this section shall not apply to school districts in which school is in session for twelve months of each calendar year.

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6. The state board of education may grant an exemption from

this section to a school district that demonstrates highly unusual and extenuating circumstances justifying exemption from the provisions of subsections 2 to 4 of this section. Any exemption granted by the state board of education shall be valid for one academic year only.

6 171.033. 1. "Inclement weather", for purposes of this 7 section, shall be defined as ice, snow, extreme cold, flooding, 8 or a tornado, but such term shall not include excessive heat.

9 2. (1) A district shall be required to make up the first 10 six days of school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather and 11 half the number of days lost or cancelled in excess of six days if the makeup of the days is necessary to ensure that the 12 13 district's students will attend a minimum of one hundred 14 forty-two days and a minimum of one thousand forty-four hours for 15 the school year except as otherwise provided in this section. 16 Schools with a four-day school week may schedule such make-up 17 days on Fridays.

18 Notwithstanding subdivision (1) of this subsection, in (2)19 school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, a district shall be 20 required to make up the first thirty-six hours of school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather and half the number of hours 21 22 lost or cancelled in excess of thirty-six if the makeup of the 23 hours is necessary to ensure that the district's students attend 24 a minimum of one thousand forty-four hours for the school year, 25 except as otherwise provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this 26 section.

3. (1) In the 2009-10 school year and subsequent years, a
school district may be exempt from the requirement to make up
days of school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather in the

1 school district when the school district has made up the six days 2 required under subsection 2 of this section and half the number 3 of additional lost or cancelled days up to eight days, resulting 4 in no more than ten total make-up days required by this section.

In school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, a school 5 (2)6 district may be exempt from the requirement to make up school 7 lost or cancelled due to inclement weather in the school district 8 when the school district has made up the thirty-six hours 9 required under subsection 2 of this section and half the number 10 of additional lost or cancelled hours up to forty-eight, 11 resulting in no more than sixty total make-up hours required by 12 this section.

13 The commissioner of education may provide, for any 4. 14 school district that cannot meet the minimum school calendar 15 requirement of at least one hundred seventy-four days for schools 16 with a five-day school week or one hundred forty-two days for 17 schools with a four-day school week and one thousand forty-four 18 hours of actual pupil attendance or, in school year 2019-20 and 19 subsequent years, one thousand forty-four hours of actual pupil 20 attendance, upon request, a waiver to be excused from such requirement. This waiver shall be requested from the 21 22 commissioner of education and may be granted if the school was 23 closed due to circumstances beyond school district control, 24 including inclement weather or fire.

5. For the 2018-2019 school year, a district shall be
 exempt from the requirements of subsections 2 and 3 of this
 section, and only be required to make up the first six days of
 school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather.

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Section B. Because of the high number of school days lost

due to inclement weather this year, the repeal and reenactment of 1 2 section 171.033 of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate 3 preservation of the public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of 4 the constitution, and the repeal and reenactment of section 5 6 171.033 of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its 7 passage and approval."; and
