## 2019 LEGISLATIVE REPORT

#### Senate Bill 450: Exemption From Current Opioid Limitations for Sickle Cell Treatment

Individuals battling sickle cell disease are often denied opioid medication to treat their pain because of the opioid limitations under current law. **Senate Bill 450** exempts individuals battling sickle cell disease from the current opioid limitations. During debate, SB 450 was added to **Senate Bill 514**, which was passed by the General Assembly. During the legislative session, I met with advocates on Sickle Cell Advocacy Day to discuss important issues facing those who are battling sickle cell disease and ways in which I can provide support. I certainly understand the opioid limitations are meant to help battle opioid addiction in our state, but for sickle cell patients, opioids are often the best choice for their pain management. I was proud to sponsor this legislation, and I am thrilled it was passed by the General Assembly and signed into law by the governor.

## Senate Bill 426: ABLE Accounts

Senate Bill 426 reforms ABLE accounts, which are savings accounts allowing Missourians with disabilities to establish a tax-free savings plan without losing federal benefits. Currently, Missourians are required to become a conservator if they need to manage their family member's ABLE account. Senate Bill 426 states that assets held in an ABLE account will not be considered property of a conservatorship estate. In other words, if an individual only needs to manage a family member's ABLE account and no other aspect of their finances, they may do so without becoming a conservator. Often the process to become a conservator is an obstacle for families during an already difficult time. I am hopeful



this legislation will make the process easier.

After I introduced this legislation in committee, I worked with one of my fellow senators to add SB 426 to **Senate Bill 230**, which deals with the appointments of conservators and guardians. Senate Bill 230 was passed by the General Assembly and was signed into law by the governor on July 10.

# Cloria Brown Memorial Highway and 2020 Fiscal Year Budget

## House Bill 448: Cloria Brown Memorial Highway in St. Louis County


**House Bill 448** was one of the first pieces of legislation passed by both chambers of the Legislature in 2019. It designates a section of highway in St. Louis County as the "Rep. Cloria Brown Memorial Highway." Mrs. Cloria Brown served St. Louis County as a state representative for six years starting in 2010. Sadly, Mrs. Brown passed away last March. During her time in the Missouri House of Representatives, she worked hard on a number of issues to improve the lives of all Missourians. She certainly had an impact on everyone she worked with during her time in the General Assembly. I was proud to support this legislation honoring her work in the Legislature and remembering her impact on our community.

## 2020 Fiscal Year Budget

Each year, the Missouri General Assembly must create and approve a balanced budget for the next fiscal year. The Fiscal Year 2020 budget totalled \$29.657 billion. We fully funded the Foundation Formula for K-12 schools and allocated funds for the repair of our state's transportation infrastructure.

## St. Louis YouthBuild

I am thrilled the General Asssembly was able to provide \$250,000 in funding for St. Louis YouthBuild as a part of the 2020 state operating budget.

St. Louis YouthBuild is an incredible organization that aims to inspire young men and women to become leaders in their community by earning their GED, learning leadership skills and obtaining employment.

St. Louis YouthBuild provides a secure and supportive learning environment for young adults ages 18-24 who dropped out of high school. This organization is an alternative school and pre-apprenticeship program that helps young men and women earn high school equivalency certificates and learn job skills in the construction field. The program also focuses on leadership development training, computer skills, occupational training and opportunities to earn construction certificates including carpentry, green building, weatherization and OSHA-10.

One of the governor's top priorities this year was workforce development and getting Missourians back to work. It was important to fund this program so it can continue to educate and inspire young men and women in St. Louis to reach their full potential.

I am excited to see St. Louis YouthBuild expand and continue to mentor and encourage young adults in our community.
