AN ACT

To amend chapter 116, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the petition process for amending the law, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 116, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 116.045, to read as follows:

116.045. 1. Initiative and referendum petition signature pages shall be printed on a form as prescribed by the secretary of state, which shall include all of the information and statements set forth in sections 116.030 and 116.040, as applicable, and comply with section 116.050. The form shall be made available in electronic format for

- 6 printing and circulating petitions.
 - 2. Signatures gathered after the effective date of this section shall not be counted as valid unless such signatures are submitted on a petition sheet form prescribed by the secretary of state pursuant to subsection 1 of this section and submitted as part of the sample sheet required pursuant to section 116.332.
- 3. Notwithstanding subsection 2 of this section to the contrary, sample sheets submitted and approved prior to the effective date of this section may still be submitted to the secretary of state with an originally-submitted sample sheet signature page that solely contains signatures gathered prior to the effective date of this section, provided that the contact designee shall notify the secretary of state that such signature page will be submitted. Failure to so notify shall result in such signatures being invalid.

Section B. Because immediate action is needed to provide the secretary of state the requisite time to apply a consistent process to all petitions submitted,
