AN ACT

To repeal section 59.100, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to bonds for county recorders of deeds.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 59.100, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 59.100, to read as follows:

59.100. 1. Every recorder elected prior to January 1, 2020, as provided

- 2 in section 59.020, before entering upon the duties of the office as recorder, shall
- 3 enter into bond to the state, in a sum set by the county commission of not less
- 4 than one thousand dollars, with sufficient sureties, not less than two, to be
- 5 approved by the commission, conditioned for the faithful performance of the
- 6 duties enjoined on such person by law as recorder, and for the delivering up of
- the records, books, papers, writings, seals, furniture and apparatus belonging to
- 3 the office, whole, safe and undefaced, to such officer's successor.
- 9 2. Every recorder elected after January 1, 2020, as provided in
- 10 section 59.020, before entering upon the duties of the office as recorder,
- 11 shall enter into bond to the state, in a sum set by the county
- 12 commission of not less than five thousand dollars, with sufficient
- 13 sureties, not less than two, to be approved by the commission,
- 14 conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties enjoined on such
- 15 person by law as recorder, and for the delivering up of the records,
- 16 books, papers, writings, seals, furniture, and apparatus belonging to the
- 17 office, whole, safe, and undefaced, to such officer's successor.
