### **HUNTING SEASONS**

Missouri offers some of the best deer, turkey, waterfowl and small game hunting in the nation.

Deer hunting seasons are typically scheduled for the late fall and early winter months. Turkey hunting season dates vary from the late fall to early winter months and usually include a spring hunting season.

Please visit www.huntfish.mdc.mo.gov to learn more about Missouri's hunting season dates and regulations, and for more information on the permits required during certain seasons.

**Directions:** From eastbound I-64, exit onto Chesterfield Airport Road and take Olive Street/Eatherton Road 3 miles west to the area entrance. From westbound I-64, exit onto Long Road and take Chesterfield Airport Road west 2 miles, then Olive Street/Eatherton Road west 3 miles to the area entrance.

The boat ramp is in St. Louis County; from I-44 take Exit 261 south to Business Loop 44, then west to Dozier Crossing, then south across the railroad tracks and west on Franklin Road to the access.

### **BIKING**

### **KATY TRAIL**

One of Missouri's most prominent trails is the Katy Trail, which stretches across most of the state. Over half of the 237-mile trail

follows Lewis and Clark's historic journey along the Missouri River. Along the trail, you can ride beneath towering river bluffs while eagles circle overhead. After leaving the river, the trail meanders through peaceful farmland and small-town America. The Katy Trail is ideal



for hiking, running or cycling on just about any kind of bike. Horseback riding is also allowed on a 35-mile section of the trail, from Sedalia to Clinton.

Runners love to use the Katy Trail for long distance runs, because it is flat and scenic and the crushed limestone trail surface is easy on their legs. The only drawback is there are long distances without access to water, so runners and hikers are encouraged to carry their own water. Certain parts of the trail do, however, provide easy access to restaurants and other facilities as you travel along.

### HUNTER SAFETY COURSE INFORMATION

How do I get my firearm hunting permit card?

### 1. Study and pass the Missouri Hunter Education Course.

The online course costs \$15. To complete your hunter safety course visit www.hunter-ed.com/missouri.

### 2. Complete the age-dependent certification requirements.

If you are 16 years or older, after successfully completing the online course, you should immediately print out your proof of online course completion.

If you are under 16 years of age, you should immediately print out your proof of online course completion, which you will need to bring with you to the Hunter Education Skills Session.

### 3. Obtain your Conservation Permit Card.

If you are 16 years or older, your permanent Conservation Permit Card will be mailed to you by the Missouri Department of Conservation.

If you are under 16 years of age, you will receive your permanent Conservation Permit Card after successfully completing the Hunter Education Skills Session.
