## AN ACT

To repeal sections 301.700, 301.703, 301.707, 301.709, and 301.711, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to all-terrain vehicles.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Sections 301.700, 301.703, 301.707, 301.709, and 301.711, RSMo, are repealed and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 301.700, 301.709, and 301.711, to read as follows:

301.700. All-terrain vehicles shall be treated in the same manner as motor vehicles, pursuant to this chapter, for the purposes of transfer, titling, perfection of liens and encumbrances, and the collection of all taxes, fees and other charges, **except that the owner may, but shall not be required to, obtain a certificate of ownership or title for the vehicle.** Funds collected by the department of revenue pursuant to sections 301.700 to 301.714 shall be deposited by the director in the state treasury to the credit of the general revenue fund. An applicant that purchases a used all-terrain vehicle after August 28, 2014, that was defined as a utility or recreational off-highway vehicle prior to August 28, 2014, may present a notarized bill of sale as evidence of lawful ownership when a certificate of title has not been issued for such all-terrain vehicle.

301.709. Application for registration [shall] **with the department of revenue may** be made to the department [of revenue] on a form as the director shall prescribe, which shall contain a complete description of the all-terrain vehicle, including the manufacturer's identification number and the name and address of the owner of the all-terrain vehicle.

301.711. 1. Upon receipt of the application for registration and the appropriate fee, the department of revenue shall issue a decal showing the

3 registration number and expiration date. The decal shall be displayed at all  
4 times and be affixed to the right front fork or frame of the all-terrain vehicle  
5 where it is clearly visible.

6 2. The fee for registration of an all-terrain vehicle shall be ten  
7 dollars. The registration of an all-terrain vehicle shall be valid for a period of  
8 three years. [The penalty fee of five dollars shall be paid on all delinquent  
9 registrations at the time the owner makes application for registration.]

10 3. In the event of the loss, mutilation or destruction of any certificate of  
11 registration or decal issued by the director of revenue, the lawful holder thereof  
12 [shall] **may**, within five days, file with the director of revenue an application and  
13 an affidavit stating such fact, and [shall] on the payment of seven dollars and  
14 fifty cents, [obtain] **shall be issued** a duplicate of such certificate of registration  
15 or decal.

16 4. The director of revenue shall deposit all fees collected pursuant to  
17 sections 301.707 to 301.714 in the state treasury to the credit of the general  
18 revenue fund.

[301.703. It shall be unlawful for any person to own an  
2 all-terrain vehicle in this state unless a certificate of ownership has  
3 been issued as herein provided. Application for a certificate of  
4 ownership shall be made within thirty days after the applicant  
5 acquires the all-terrain vehicle, or within one hundred twenty days  
6 after April 19, 1988, whichever is later.]

[301.707. 1. No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle  
2 within the state unless the all-terrain vehicle has been registered  
3 with the department of revenue.

4 2. A registration is not required for the following:

5 (1) All-terrain vehicles owned and operated by the United  
6 States, another state, or a political subdivision thereof;

7 (2) All-terrain vehicles owned and operated by this state or  
8 by any municipality or political subdivision thereof;

9 (3) All-terrain vehicles covered by a valid registration of  
10 another state or country that have not been within this state for  
11 more than thirty days.

12 3. No person under sixteen years of age shall be allowed to  
13 register an all-terrain vehicle.]

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
