AN ACT

To amend chapter 161, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to required data collection by the department of elementary and secondary education, with an effective date.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 161, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 161.625, to read as follows:

- 161.625. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 2 "Students' Right to Know Act".
- 2. The following information shall be collected and compiled by
- 4 the department of elementary and secondary education on an annual
- 5 basis:
- 6 (1) The most in-demand jobs in the state, including starting 7 salary and education level required for such jobs;
- 8 (2) The average cost for all major colleges and vocational schools 9 in the state:
- 10 (3) The average monthly student loan payment for individuals 11 who attend all major colleges and vocational schools in the state;
- 12 (4) The average three-year student loan default rate for all major 13 colleges and vocational schools in the state;
- 14 (5) The average graduation rate for all major colleges and 15 vocational schools in the state;
- 16 (6) The completion rates for apprenticeship programs, high 17 school credential programs, career and technical education programs, 18 and military first-term enlistments;
- 19 (7) The share of college graduates working in an occupation that 20 does not require a college degree for each major;

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21 (8) The average starting salary for individuals graduating from 22 a major college;

- 23 (9) The average starting salary for individuals graduating from 24 a vocational school in the state.
- 3. The information collected by the department shall be distributed to every public high school in the state for public distribution to students by school guidance counselors no later than October fifteenth of each year.
- 4. The department shall have the authority to execute a memorandum of understanding with any department, agency or division for information required to be collected by this act.

Section B. Section A of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2021.
