## AN ACT

To repeal sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to absentee voting, with existing penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, are repealed

- 2 and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.277,
- 3 115.279, and 115.283, to read as follows:
  - 115.277. 1. Except as provided in subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this
- 2 section, any registered voter of this state may vote by absentee ballot for all
- 3 candidates and issues for which such voter [would be] is eligible to vote at the
- 4 polling place [if such voter expects to be prevented from going to the polls to vote
- 5 on election day due to:
- 6 (1) Absence on election day from the jurisdiction of the election authority
- 7 in which such voter is registered to vote;
- 8 (2) Incapacity or confinement due to illness or physical disability,
- 9 including a person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of a person
- 10 who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or disability;
- 11 (3) Religious belief or practice;
- 12 (4) Employment as an election authority, as a member of an election
- 13 authority, or by an election authority at a location other than such voter's polling
- 14 place;
- 15 (5) Incarceration, provided all qualifications for voting are retained;
- 16 (6) Certified participation in the address confidentiality program
- 17 established under sections 589.660 to 589.681 because of safety concerns].

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

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- 18 2. Any covered voter, as defined in section 115.275, who is eligible to 19 register and vote in this state may vote in any election for federal office, statewide office, state legislative office, or statewide ballot initiatives by 20 21 submitting a federal postcard application to apply to vote by absentee ballot or 22 by submitting a federal postcard application at the polling place even though the 23person is not registered. A federal postcard application submitted by a covered voter pursuant to this subsection shall also serve as a voter registration 2425 application under section 115.908 and the election authority shall, if satisfied 26 that the applicant is entitled to register, place the voter's name on the voter 27 registration file. Each covered voter may vote by absentee ballot or, upon 28 submitting an affidavit that the person is qualified to vote in the election, may 29 vote at the person's polling place.
- 30 3. Any interstate former resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may 31 vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors.
- 32 4. Any intrastate new resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote 33 by absentee ballot at the election for presidential and vice presidential electors, 34 United States senator, representative in Congress, statewide elected officials and statewide questions, propositions and amendments from such resident's new 35 36 jurisdiction of residence after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence. 37
- 38 5. Any new resident [, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors after registering to vote in 39 40 such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.
- 115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may be made by the  $^{2}$ applicant in person, or by mail, or for the applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity. The 3 election authority shall accept applications by facsimile transmission and by electronic mail within the limits of its telecommunications capacity.
- 2. Each application shall be made to the election authority of the jurisdiction in which the person is or would be registered. Each application shall be in writing and shall state the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for voting an absentee ballot] whether 10 the applicant is incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability or is a person who is primarily responsible for the physical 12 care of a person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability, the address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing

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is requested, and for absent uniformed services and overseas applicants, the applicant's email address if electronic transmission is requested. If the [reason for the applicant voting absentee is due to the reasons established under 16 subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of section 115.277] applicant is a certified 17 participant in the address confidentiality program established under 18 sections 589.660 to 589.681, the applicant shall state the voter's identification 19 information provided by the address confidentiality program in lieu of the 20 applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, and 21address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is requested. Each 22application to vote in a primary election shall also state which ballot the 23 applicant wishes to receive. If any application fails to designate a ballot, the 2425 election authority shall, within three working days after receiving the application, 26 notify the applicant by mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee ballot until the applicant designates which political party ballot he or she wishes to 27 28 receive. If the applicant does not respond to the request for political party 29 designation, the election authority is authorized to provide the voter with that 30 part of the ballot for which no political party designation is required.

- 3. [Except as provided in subsection 3 of section 115.281,] All applications for absentee ballots received prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be stored at the office of the election authority until such time as the applications are processed in accordance with section 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot received in the office of the election authority by mail, by facsimile transmission, by electronic mail, or by a guardian or relative after 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any election authority. No application for an absentee ballot submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 p.m. on the day before the election shall be accepted by any election authority, except as provided in subsections 6, 8 and 9 of this section.
- 42 4. Each application for an absentee ballot shall be signed by the applicant 43 or, if the application is made by a guardian or relative pursuant to this section, the application shall be signed by the guardian or relative, who shall note on the 44 application his or her relationship to the applicant. If an applicant, guardian or 45 relative is blind, unable to read or write the English language or physically 46 47 incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign by mark, witnessed by 48 the signature of an election official or person of his or her own choosing. Any person who knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee ballot 49

50 application shall be guilty of a class one election offense.

- 5. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any resident of the state of Missouri who resides outside the boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States or members of their immediate family living with them may request an absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general election with one application.
- (2) The election authority shall provide each absent uniformed services voter and each overseas voter who submits a voter registration application or an absentee ballot request, if the election authority rejects the application or request, with the reasons for the rejection.
- (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if a standard oath regarding material misstatements of fact is adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall accept such oath for voter registration, absentee ballot, or other election-related materials.
- (4) Not later than sixty days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office, each election authority which administered the election shall submit to the secretary of state in a format prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number of absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters for the election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a combined report of such information not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office and in a standardized format developed by the commission pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make the report available to the general public.
- (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in 52 U.S.C. Section 20310.
- 6. An application for an absentee ballot by a new resident shall be submitted in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority in the election jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. The application shall be received by the election authority no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. Such application shall be in the form of an affidavit, executed in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or any authorized officer of the election authority, and in substantially the following form:

An application for an absentee ballot by an interstate former resident shall be received in the office of the election authority where the applicant was formerly registered by 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday immediately prior to the election, unless the application is made in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority, in which case such application shall be made no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.

115.283. 1. Each ballot envelope shall bear a statement on which the voter shall state the voter's name, the voter's voting address, and the voter's mailing address [and the voter's reason for voting an absentee ballot]. If the [reason for the voter voting absentee is due to the reasons established under subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of section 115.277], applicant is a certified participant in the address confidentiality program established under sections 589.660 to 589.681 the voter shall state the voter's identification information provided by the address confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, voting address, and mailing address. On the form, the voter 9 10 shall also state under penalties of perjury that the voter is qualified to vote in the 11 election, that the voter has not previously voted and will not vote again in the election, that the voter has personally marked the voter's ballot in secret or 13 supervised the marking of the voter's ballot if the voter is unable to mark it, that the ballot has been placed in the ballot envelope and sealed by the voter or under SB 657

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contained in the statement is true. In addition, any person providing assistance to the absentee voter shall include a statement on the envelope identifying the 17 person providing assistance under penalties of perjury. Persons authorized to 18 vote only for federal and statewide officers shall also state their former Missouri 19 20 residence. 21 2. 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- 6. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, any covered voter as defined in section 115.902 or persons who have declared themselves to be permanently disabled pursuant to section 115.284, otherwise entitled to vote, shall not be required to obtain a notary seal or signature on his or her absentee ballot.
  - 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section or section 115.291 to the contrary, the subscription, signature and seal of a notary or other officer authorized to administer oaths shall not be required on any ballot, ballot envelope, or statement required by this section if the [reason for the] voter voting absentee is [due to the reasons established pursuant to subdivision (2) of subsection 1 of section 115.277] incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability, including a person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of a person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability.
- 8. No notary shall charge or collect a fee for notarizing the signature on any absentee ballot or absentee voter registration.
- 9. A notary public who charges more than the maximum fee specified or who charges or collects a fee for notarizing the signature on any absentee ballot or absentee voter registration is guilty of official misconduct.

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
