AN ACT

To repeal sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to voting in elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, are repealed

- 2 and four new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.274,
- 3 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, to read as follows:
 - 115.274. 1. Any registered voter of this state may vote in advance
- 2 of election day, without having to state an excuse, in person or by mail
- 3 for any general election as follows:
- 4 (1) Early voting shall be conducted from the sixth Tuesday
- 5 before the election until 7:00 p.m. on the Monday immediately before
- 6 the election. The hours for conducting early voting shall be the regular
- 7 business hours of each local election authority, provided that for the
- 8 twenty-one days immediately before election day, the hours shall also
- 9 include from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday and
- 10 beginning on the Tuesday immediately before election day through the
- 11 Monday immediately before the election, the hours shall be from 8:00
- 12 **a.m. to 7:00 p.m.**;
- 13 (2) The local election authority shall establish early voting
- 14 locations as follows:
- 15 (a) There shall be one early voting location for every three
- 16 precincts within the jurisdiction of the local election authority,
- 17 provided that there shall be at least one early voting location within
- 18 the jurisdiction of each local election authority;

19 (b) Early voting locations shall be as centrally located as is 20 practicable; and

- 21 (c) In choosing early voting locations, the local election authority 22 shall consider the following factors:
- 23 a. The geographic location and demographics of voters in the 24 previous federal general election;
 - b. Current United States census data;
- 26 c. The availability of suitable satellite early voting locations 27 within the local election authority; and
- 28 d. Any other factor deemed relevant by the local election 29 authority.
 - 2. The local election authority shall provide adequate public notice of the early voting locations by posting the hours and locations for early voting at the local election authority's office, on the local election authority's website, and by other reasonable methods selected by the local election authority.
- 35 3. The local election authority shall appoint at least one election judge from each major political party to serve at each early voting 36 location. Procedures for selecting election judges, designating election 37 38 challengers, casting ballots, and tabulating ballots shall be the same as otherwise provided in this chapter. 39
- 4. Upon request by any person or entity, the election authority or the secretary of state shall furnish media in an electronic format or, if so requested, in a printed format, showing the names, addresses, and voter identification numbers of voters within the jurisdiction of a 44 specific election authority who voted pursuant to this section.
- 115.277. 1. Except as provided in subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this section, any registered voter of this state may vote by absentee ballot for all candidates and issues for which such voter [would be] is eligible to vote at the polling place [if such voter expects to be prevented from going to the polls to vote on election day due to: 5
- 6 (1) Absence on election day from the jurisdiction of the election authority in which such voter is registered to vote; 7
- (2) Incapacity or confinement due to illness or physical disability, 8 including a person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of a person 9 10 who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or disability;
- 11 (3) Religious belief or practice;

12 (4) Employment as an election authority, as a member of an election 13 authority, or by an election authority at a location other than such voter's polling 14 place;

- (5) Incarceration, provided all qualifications for voting are retained;
- 16 (6) Certified participation in the address confidentiality program 17 established under sections 589.660 to 589.681 because of safety concerns].
- 18 2. Any covered voter, as defined in section 115.275, who is eligible to 19 register and vote in this state may vote in any election for federal office, 20 statewide office, state legislative office, or statewide ballot initiatives by 21 submitting a federal postcard application to apply to vote by absentee ballot or 22 by submitting a federal postcard application at the polling place even though the 23 person is not registered. A federal postcard application submitted by a covered 24voter pursuant to this subsection shall also serve as a voter registration application under section 115.908 and the election authority shall, if satisfied 25 26 that the applicant is entitled to register, place the voter's name on the voter registration file. Each covered voter may vote by absentee ballot or, upon 27 28 submitting an affidavit that the person is qualified to vote in the election, may 29 vote at the person's polling place.
- 3. Any interstate former resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors.
- 4. Any intrastate new resident[, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee ballot at the election for presidential and vice presidential electors, United States senator, representative in Congress, statewide elected officials and statewide questions, propositions and amendments from such resident's new jurisdiction of residence after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.
- 5. Any new resident [, as defined in section 115.275,] may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.
- 115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may be made by the applicant in person, or by mail, or for the applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity. The election authority shall accept applications by facsimile transmission and by electronic mail within the limits of its telecommunications capacity.
- 6 2. Each application shall be made to the election authority of the 7 jurisdiction in which the person is or would be registered. Each application shall

be in writing and shall state the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for voting an absentee ballot] whether the applicant is incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability or is a person who is primarily responsible for the physical 11 care of a person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or 12 physical disability, the address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing 13 14 is requested, and for absent uniformed services and overseas applicants, the applicant's email address if electronic transmission is requested. If the [reason for the applicant voting absentee is due to the reasons established under 16 subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of section 115.277] applicant is a certified participant in the address confidentiality program established under 18 19 sections 589.660 to 589.681, the applicant shall state the voter's identification 20 information provided by the address confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, and 22address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is requested. Each application to vote in a primary election shall also state which ballot the applicant wishes to receive. If any application fails to designate a ballot, the 25 election authority shall, within three working days after receiving the application, 26 notify the applicant by mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee ballot until the applicant designates which political party ballot he or she wishes to receive. If the applicant does not respond to the request for political party designation, the election authority is authorized to provide the voter with that part of the ballot for which no political party designation is required.

- 3. [Except as provided in subsection 3 of section 115.281,] All applications for absentee ballots received prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be stored at the office of the election authority until such time as the applications are processed in accordance with section 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot received in the office of the election authority by mail, by facsimile transmission, by electronic mail, or by a guardian or relative after 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any election authority. No application for an absentee ballot submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 p.m. on the day before the election shall be accepted by any election authority, except as provided in subsections 6, 8 and 9 of this section.
- 42 4. Each application for an absentee ballot shall be signed by the applicant 43 or, if the application is made by a guardian or relative pursuant to this section,

the application shall be signed by the guardian or relative, who shall note on the application his or her relationship to the applicant. If an applicant, guardian or relative is blind, unable to read or write the English language or physically incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign by mark, witnessed by the signature of an election official or person of his or her own choosing. Any person who knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee ballot application shall be guilty of a class one election offense.

- 5. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any resident of the state of Missouri who resides outside the boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States or members of their immediate family living with them may request an absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general election with one application.
- (2) The election authority shall provide each absent uniformed services voter and each overseas voter who submits a voter registration application or an absentee ballot request, if the election authority rejects the application or request, with the reasons for the rejection.
- (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if a standard oath regarding material misstatements of fact is adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall accept such oath for voter registration, absentee ballot, or other election-related materials.
- (4) Not later than sixty days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office, each election authority which administered the election shall submit to the secretary of state in a format prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number of absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters for the election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a combined report of such information not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office and in a standardized format developed by the commission pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make the report available to the general public.
- 75 (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" 76 and "overseas voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in 52 U.S.C. Section 77 20310.
 - 6. An application for an absentee ballot by a new resident shall be submitted in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority in the

election jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. The application shall be 80 received by the election authority no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.
