AN ACT

To amend chapter 376, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to hearing aids.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 376, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 376.1197, to read as follows:

376.1197. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

- 3 (1) "Hearing care professional", a person who is a licensed 4 hearing instrument dispenser, licensed audiologist, or licensed 5 physician;
- 6 (2) "Hearing instrument" or "hearing aid", any wearable 7 nondisposable, nonexperimental instrument or device designed to aid 8 or compensate for impaired human hearing and any parts, attachments, 9 or accessories for the instrument or device, including an ear mold but 10 excluding batteries and cords.
- 2. An individual or group policy of accident and health insurance or managed care plan that is amended, delivered, issued, or renewed after August 28, 2020, shall provide coverage for medically necessary hearing instruments and related services for all individuals under the age of eighteen when a hearing care professional prescribes a hearing instrument to augment communication.
- 3. An insurer shall provide coverage, subject to all applicable copayments, co-insurance, deductibles, and out-of-pocket limits, subject to the following restrictions:
- 20 (1) One hearing instrument shall be covered for each ear every 21 thirty-six months;

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22 (2) Related services including, but not limited to, audiological 23 exams and selection, fitting, and adjustment of ear molds to maintain 24 optimal fit shall be covered when deemed medically necessary by a 25 hearing care professional; and

- 26 (3) Hearing instrument repairs may be covered when deemed 27 medically necessary.
- 4. Any hearing aid provided to a person under the age of eighteen under this section shall be in addition to any initial amplification provided under section 376.1220.
- 5. If, at any time before or after August 28, 2020, the Secretary 31 of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, or its 32successor agency, promulgates rules or regulations to be published in 33 the Federal Register, or issues an opinion, guidance, or other action 34that would require the state, pursuant to any provision of the Patient 35Protection and Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. 111-148) including, but not 36 37limited to, 42 U.S.C. 18031(d)(3)(B) or any successor provision, to defray 38 the cost of coverage for medically necessary hearing instruments and related services for individuals under the age of eighteen, this section 39 40 is inoperative with respect to all such coverage other than that authorized under Section 1902 of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 41 42 1396a, and the state shall not assume any obligation for the cost of coverage for medically necessary hearing instruments and related services for individuals under the age of eighteen.
