AN ACT

To repeal sections 321.015, 321.190, and 321.603, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to fire protection districts.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 321.015, 321.190, and 321.603, RSMo, are repealed

- 2 and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 321.015,
- 3 321.190, and 321.603, to read as follows:
 - 321.015. 1. No person holding any lucrative office or employment under
- 2 this state, or any political subdivision thereof as defined in section 70.120, shall
- B hold the office of fire protection district director under this chapter. When any
- 4 fire protection district director accepts any office or employment under this state
- 5 or any political subdivision thereof, his office shall thereby be vacated and he
- 6 shall thereafter perform no duty and receive no salary or expenses as fire
- 7 protection district director.
- 8 2. This section shall not apply to:
- 9 (1) Members of the organized militia, of the reserve corps, public school
- 10 employees, law enforcement agency employees, and notaries public;
- 11 (2) Fire protection districts located wholly within counties of the second,
- 12 third or fourth classification;
- 13 (3) Fire protection districts in counties of the first classification with less
- 14 than eighty-five thousand inhabitants;
- 15 (4) Fire protection districts located within counties of the first
- 16 classification not adjoining any other county of the first classification;
- 17 (5) Fire protection districts located within any county of the first or
- 18 second classification not having more than nine hundred thousand inhabitants

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- 3. For the purposes of this section, the term "lucrative office or
- 28 employment" does not include receiving retirement benefits, compensation for
- 29 expenses, or a stipend or per diem, in an amount not to exceed seventy-five
- 30 dollars for each day of service, for service rendered to a fire protection district,
- 31 the state or any political subdivision thereof.
 - 321.190. Each member of the board may receive an attendance fee [not to exceed one hundred dollars] upon affirmative board approval and in an
 - 3 amount set by the board for attending each regularly called board meeting, or
 - 4 special meeting, but shall not be paid for attending more than [two in any
- 5 calendar month, except that in a county of the first class having a charter form
- 6 of government, he shall not be paid for attending more than four in any calendar
- 7 month. However, no board member shall be paid more than one attendance fee
- 8 if such member attends more than one board meeting in a calendar week] one
- 9 board meeting in a calendar week. In addition, the chairman of the board
- 10 of directors may receive fifty dollars for attending each regularly or specially
- 11 called board meeting[, but shall not be paid the additional fee for attending more
- 12 than two meetings in any calendar month]. Each member of the board shall be
- 13 reimbursed for his or her actual expenditures in the performance of his or her
- 14 duties on behalf of the district. The secretary and the treasurer, if members of
- 15 the board of directors, may each receive such additional compensation for the
- 16 performance of their respective duties as secretary and treasurer as the board
- 17 shall deem reasonable and necessary, not to exceed one thousand dollars per
- 18 year. The circuit court having jurisdiction over the district shall have power to
- 19 remove directors or any of them for good cause shown upon a petition, notice and
- 20 hearing.

 - 2 321.190 for fire protection districts located in a county of the first classification
 - 3 with a charter form of government, each member of any such fire protection
