AN ACT

To repeal section 345.050, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to licensing of speech pathologists and audiologists.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 345.050, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 345.050, to read as follows:

345.050. 1. To be eligible for licensure by the board by examination, each applicant shall submit the application fee and shall furnish evidence of such

(1) Hold a master's or a doctoral degree from a program that was

- 5 awarded "accreditation candidate" status or is accredited by the Council on

- 9 (2) Submit official transcripts from one or more accredited colleges or
- 10 universities presenting evidence of the completion of course work and clinical
- 11 practicum requirements equivalent to that required by the Council on Academic
- 12 Accreditation of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association or other
- 13 accrediting agency approved by the board; and
- 14 (3) Pass an examination promulgated or approved by the board. The
- 15 board shall determine the subject and scope of the examinations.
- 16 2. To be eligible for licensure by the board without examination, each
- 17 applicant shall make application on forms prescribed by the board, submit the
- 18 application fee and shall be of good moral and ethical character, submit an
- 19 activity statement and meet one of the following requirements:
 - (1) The board shall issue a license to any speech-language pathologist or

whose requirements are substantially equal to, or greater than, Missouri at the

time the applicant applies for licensure; or 25

26 (2) Hold the certificate of clinical competence issued by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association in the area in which licensure is sought. 27
