2	by inserting after all of said line the following:
3	"304.900. 1. As used in this section, the following
4	terms mean:
5	(1) "Agent", a person given the responsibility, by an
6	entity, of navigating and operating a personal delivery
7	device;
8	(2) "Personal delivery device", a powered device_
9	operated primarily on sidewalks and crosswalks, intended
10	primarily for the transport of property on public rights-of-
11	way, and capable of navigating with or without the active
12	control or monitoring of a natural person. Notwithstanding
13	any other provision of law, a "personal delivery device"
14	shall not be defined as a motor vehicle or a vehicle;
15	(3) "Personal delivery device operator", an entity or
16	its agent that exercises physical control or monitoring over
17	the navigation system and operation of a personal delivery
18	device. A "personal delivery device operator" does not
19	include an entity or person that requests or receives the
20	services of a personal delivery device for the purpose of
21	transporting property or an entity or person who merely
22	arranges for and dispatches the requested services of a
23	personal delivery device.
24	2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a
25	personal delivery device is authorized to operate in this
26	<pre>state:</pre>

27	(1) On any sidewalk or crosswalk of any county or
28	municipality in the state; and
29	(2) On any roadway of any county or municipality in
30	the state, provided that the personal delivery device shall
31	not unreasonably interfere with motor vehicles or traffic.
32	3. A personal delivery device shall:
33	(1) Not block public rights-of-way;
34	(2) Obey all traffic and pedestrian control signals
35	and devices;
36	(3) Operate at a speed that does not exceed a maximum
37	speed of ten miles per hour on a sidewalk or crosswalk;
38	(4) Contain a unique identifying number that is
39	displayed on the device;
40	(5) Include a means of identifying the personal
41	delivery device operator; and
42	(6) Be equipped with a system that enables the
43	personal delivery device to come to a controlled stop.
44	4. Subject to the requirements of this section, a
45	personal delivery device operating on a sidewalk or
46	crosswalk shall have all the responsibilities applicable to
47	a pedestrian under the same circumstances.
48	5. A personal delivery device shall be exempt from
49	motor vehicle registration requirements.
50	6. A personal delivery device operator shall maintain
51	an insurance policy that provides general liability coverage
52	of at least one hundred thousand dollars for damages arising
53	from the combined operations of personal delivery devices
54	under a personal delivery device operator's control.
55	7. If the personal delivery device is being operated
56	between sunset and sunrise, it shall be equipped with
57	lighting on both the front and rear of the personal delivery

device visible in clear weather from a distance of at least

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- five hundred feet to the front and rear of the personaldelivery device.
- 8. A personal delivery device shall not be used for
 the transportation of hazardous material regulated under the
 Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, 49 USC Section 5103,
 and required to be placarded under 49 CFR Part 172, Subpart
 F.
- 66 9. Nothing in this section shall prohibit a political subdivision from regulating the operation of personal 67 68 delivery devices on a highway or pedestrian area to insure the welfare and safety of its residents. However, political 69 70 subdivisions shall not regulate the design, manufacture and 71 maintenance of a personal delivery device nor the types of property that may be transported by a personal delivery 72 device. Additionally, no political subdivision shall treat 73 74 personal delivery devices differently for the purposes of 75 assessment and taxation or other charges from personal 76 property that is similar in nature.
- 77 10. A personal delivery device operator may not sell or disclose a personally identifiable likeness to a third 78 party in exchange for monetary compensation. For purposes 79 80 of this section, a personally identifiable likeness includes photographic images, videos, digital image files, or other 81 82 digital data that can be used to either directly or indirectly identify an individual. "Personally identifiable 83 84 likeness" does not include aggregated or anonymized data. 85 The use of any personally identifiable likeness by a personal delivery device operator to improve their products 86 and services is allowed under this section. Information 87 that would otherwise be protected under this section as 88 confidential shall only be provided to a law enforcement 89 entity with a properly executed, lawful subpoena."; and 90 91 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
