## **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 173, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to student associations at public institutions of higher learning.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 173, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 two new sections, to be known as sections 173.1555 and 173.1556,
- 3 to read as follows:
  - 173.1555. As used in this section and section
- 2 173.1556, the following terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Adverse action", any action or policy that denies
- 4 a belief-based student association any benefit available to
- 5 other student associations or organizations or that
- 6 otherwise discriminates with respect to any such benefit;
- 7 (2) "Belief-based student association" includes, but
- 8 shall not be limited to, any political or ideological
- 9 student association or any religious student organization;
- 10 (3) "Benefit", recognition, registration, the use of
- 11 facilities of a public institution of higher learning for
- 12 meetings or speaking purposes, and the use of channels of
- 13 communication of a public institution of higher learning;
- 14 (4) "Public institution of higher learning", any state
- 15 postsecondary educational institution governed or supervised
- by a board erected under chapter 172, 174, 175, or 178; a
- 17 board of trustees of a community college; or any state board
- 18 for any other technical school.

173.1556. 1. No public institution of higher learning 2 shall take any adverse action against a belief-based student 3 association based on such association's requirement that its leaders be committed to furthering the association's 4 5 mission, or to adhere to the association's sincerely held 6 beliefs, sincere practice requirements, or sincere standards 7 of conduct. Such leaders shall include, but shall not be 8 limited to, any person who holds a position within the 9 association that authorizes them to participate in the 10 leadership or governance of the association or in establishing criteria for the association's leadership or 11 12 governance. Such missions, beliefs, practice requirements, 13 and standards of conduct shall be defined by the association 14 and the beliefs upon which the association is based. Any belief-based student association that has been 15 16 aggrieved as a result of a violation or threatened violation of subsection 1 of this section may assert that violation or 17 threatened violation as a claim or defense in a judicial 18 19 proceeding or in an administrative proceeding against the 20 public institution of higher learning and obtain appropriate 21 relief.
