## AN ACT

To amend chapter 290, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the reimbursement of certain expenses for certain employees.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:
Section A. Chapter 290, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 290.504 , to read as follows:
290.504. 1. Any employee who performs food delivery services and incurs delivery expenses in the course of performing such food delivery services shall be reimbursed by his or her employer for such delivery expenses as provided in this section.
2. Any employee for whom the quotient of the actual wages for a given pay period and the total amount of hours worked for the same pay period is less than the wage rate at which he or she is required to be paid pursuant to sections 290.500 to 290.530 shall be reimbursed by his or her employer for the difference between the quotient and the required wage rate.
3. An employer is not required to reimburse an employee for delivery expenses beyond what is necessary to make up the difference between the quotient described in subsection 2 of this section and the wage rate at which the employee is required to be paid pursuant to sections 290.500
to 290.530 , provided that an employer may pay an employee a greater amount of reimbursement at its discretion.
4. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:
(1) "Actual wage", for a given pay period, the difference between the total wages received by an employee who performs food delivery services and the total amount of delivery expenses incurred by such employee during the same pay period;
(2) "Delivery expense", an expense that is incurred by an employee who performs food delivery services using his or her personal vehicle. "Delivery expense" is limited to the mileage incurred during the performance of the food delivery service;
(3) "Food delivery service", transporting food from an employer's place of business to the place at which a customer has requested service by an employee using his or her personal vehicle.
