AN ACT

To amend chapter 261, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the Missouri food security task force.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 261, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 261.450, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 261.450. 1. There is hereby established the "Missouri
- 2 Food Security Task Force".
- 3 2. The task force shall be comprised of the following
- 4 members:
- 5 (1) Four members of the house of representatives, with
- 6 two members to be appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 7 representatives and two members to be appointed by the
- 8 minority floor leader of the house of representatives;
- 9 (2) Four members of the senate, with two members to be
- 10 appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate and two
- 11 members to be appointed by the minority floor leader of the
- 12 senate;
- 13 (3) The director of the department of agriculture, or
- 14 the director's designee;
- 15 (4) The director of the department of economic
- 16 development, or the director's designee;
- 17 (5) The director of the department of health and
- 18 senior services, or the director's designee;

19 (6) The director of the department of social services, 20 or the director's designee;

- 21 (7) One registered dietician, appointed by the
- 22 Missouri Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics;
- 23 (8) Two representatives from institutions of higher
- 24 education located in Missouri, with one representative
- 25 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and
- one representative appointed by the president pro tempore of
- 27 the senate; and
- 28 (9) Eight members, to be appointed by the director of
- 29 the department of agriculture, as follows:
- 30 (a) Two representatives from a food bank located in
- 31 Missouri;
- 32 (b) One representative of a business specializing in
- 33 retail or direct food sales;
- 34 (c) One representative from a community development
- 35 financial institution with experience in food retail
- 36 financing;
- 37 (d) Two local food producers, with one representing an
- 38 urban area and one representing a rural area; and
- 39 (e) Two representatives from statewide farmer-led or
- 40 farmer-based organizations.
- 41 3. The director of the department of agriculture shall
- 42 ensure that the membership of the task force reflects the
- 43 diversity of the state, with members on the task force
- 44 representing urban and rural areas and various geographic
- 45 regions of the state.
- 4. The department of agriculture shall provide
- 47 technical and administrative support as required by the task
- 48 force to fulfill its duties.
- 49 5. Members of the task force shall serve without
- 50 compensation but shall receive reimbursement for actual and

- necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the task force or any subcommittee thereof.
- 6. The task force shall hold its first meeting within two months after the effective date of this section and organize by selecting a chair and a vice chair.
 - 7. The mission of the task force shall be to:
- (1) Determine the ability of individuals located in urban and rural areas throughout the state to access healthy food and identify populations and areas in which access to food is limited or uncertain;
 - (2) Identify ways in which the state could connect resources and individuals in an effort to ensure food security for all Missourians;
- (3) Evaluate the impact of tax increment financing
 projects and restrictive deed covenants imposed by grocery
 retailers on creating food deserts or prolonging existing
 food deserts; and
- 68 (4) Evaluate the potential impacts of online food 69 retail on food insecurity throughout the state.
- 70 8. The task force shall report a summary of its
 71 activities and any recommendations for legislation to the
 72 general assembly before August 28, 2022.
- 9. The task force shall be dissolved on January 1, 2023.
