## AN ACT

To repeal sections 9.010 and $9.020, \mathrm{RSMo}$, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to state holidays.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:
Section A. Sections 9.010 and 9.020, RSMo, are repealed 2 and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as 3 sections 9.010 and 9.020, to read as follows:
9.010. The first day of January, the third Monday of 2 January, [the twelfth day of February,] the third Monday in

3 February, the Friday before Easter, the eighth day of May, 4 the last Monday in May, the fourth day of July, the first 5 Monday in September, the second Monday in October, the 6 eleventh day of November, the fourth Thursday in November, 7 and the twenty-fifth of December, are declared and 8 established public holidays; and when any of such holidays

9 falls upon Sunday, the Monday next following shall be 10 considered the holiday. There shall be no holiday for state employees on the fourth Monday of October.
9.020. In each year the third Monday of January is

2 known as "Martin Luther King Day" and the [twelfth day of
3 February is known as "Lincoln Day"] Friday before Easter is
4 known as "Good Friday" and the thirteenth day of April is
5 known as "Jefferson Day" and the second Monday in October is
6 known as "Columbus Day".

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.
