JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment to article IV of the Constitution of Missouri, by adding thereto one new section relating to the limitation of terms served by certain elected officials.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the

- 2 state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday
- 3 in November, 2022, or at a special election to be called by
- 4 the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to
- 5 the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or
- 6 rejection, the following amendment to article IV of the
- 7 Constitution of the state of Missouri:
 - Section A. Article IV, Constitution of Missouri, is
- 2 amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as
- 3 section 17(a), to read as follows:

Section 17(a). No person shall be elected lieutenant

- 2 governor, secretary of state, state auditor, or attorney
- 3 general more than twice, and no person who has held the
- 4 office of lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state
- 5 auditor, or attorney general, or acted as lieutenant
- 6 governor, secretary of state, state auditor, or attorney
- 7 general, for more than two years of a term to which some
- 8 other person was elected to such office shall be elected to
- 9 that same office more than once.

	Section B. Pursuant to chapter 116, and other
2	applicable constitutional provisions and laws of this state
3	allowing the general assembly to adopt ballot language for
4	the submission of this joint resolution to the voters of
5	this state, the official summary statement of this
6	resolution shall be as follows:
7	"Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to
8	prohibit any person from serving more than two
9	terms in each of the offices of Lieutenant
10	Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General,
11	and State Auditor?"
