Amend SS/SCS/Senate Bill No. 756, Page 1, Section 34.045, Line 16,

by inserting after all of said line the following: 2 3 1. (1) As used in this section, the term "rural electric cooperative" means any rural electric 4 cooperative organized or operating under the provisions of 5 chapter 394, any corporation organized on a nonprofit or a 6 cooperative basis as described in subsection 1 of section 7 8 394.200, or any electrical corporation operating under a 9 cooperative business plan as described in subsection 2 of section 393.110. 10 (2) The general assembly recognizes the necessity for 11 anticipating and making advance provisions to care for the 12 unusual and extraordinary burdens imposed by disasters or 13 14 emergencies on this state [and], its political subdivisions [by disasters or emergencies], and rural electric 15 16 cooperatives. To meet such situations, it is the intention of the general assembly to confer emergency powers on the 17 governor, acting through the director, and vesting the 18 governor with adequate power and authority within the 19 limitation of available funds in the Missouri disaster fund 20 21 to meet any such emergency or disaster. There is hereby established a fund to be known as 22 23 the "Missouri Disaster Fund", to which the general assembly may appropriate funds and from which funds may be 24 25 appropriated annually to the state emergency management agency. The funds appropriated shall be expended during a 26

- 27 state emergency at the direction of the governor and upon
- 28 the issuance of an emergency declaration which shall set
- 29 forth the emergency and shall state that it requires the
- 30 expenditure of public funds to furnish immediate aid and
- 31 relief. The director of the state emergency management
- 32 agency shall administer the fund.
- 33 3. Expenditures may be made upon direction of the
- 34 governor for emergency management, as defined in section
- 35 44.010, or to implement the state disaster plans.
- 36 Expenditures may also be made to meet the matching
- 37 requirements of state and federal agencies for any
- 38 applicable assistance programs.
- 4. Assistance may be provided from the Missouri
- 40 disaster fund to political subdivisions of this state
- 41 [which] and rural electric cooperatives that have suffered
- 42 from a disaster to such an extent as to impose a severe
- 43 financial burden exceeding the ordinary reserve capacity of
- 44 the subdivision or rural electric cooperative affected.
- 45 Applications for aid under this section shall be made to the
- 46 state emergency management agency on such forms as may be
- 47 prescribed and furnished by the agency, which forms shall
- 48 require the furnishing of sufficient information to
- 49 determine eligibility for aid and the extent of the
- 50 financial burden incurred. The agency may call upon other
- 51 agencies of the state in evaluating such applications. The
- 52 director of the state emergency management agency shall
- 53 review each application for aid under the provisions of this
- 54 section and recommend its approval or disapproval, in whole
- or in part, to the governor. If approved, the governor
- 56 shall determine and certify to the director of the state
- 57 emergency management agency the amount of aid to be
- 58 furnished. The director of the state emergency management
- 59 agency shall thereupon issue [his] the director's voucher to

- the commissioner of administration, who shall issue [his]
  the commissioner's warrants therefor to the applicant.
- 5. When a disaster or emergency has been proclaimed by the governor or there is a national emergency, the director of the state emergency management agency, upon order of the governor, shall have authority to expend funds for the following:
  - (1) The purposes of sections 44.010 to 44.130 and the responsibilities of the governor and the state emergency management agency as outlined in sections 44.010 to 44.130;

- (2) Employing, for the duration of the response and recovery to emergency, additional personnel and contracting or otherwise procuring necessary appliances, supplies, equipment, and transport;
- (3) Performing services for and furnishing materials and supplies to state government agencies, counties, [and] municipalities, and rural electric cooperatives with respect to performance of any duties enjoined by law upon such agencies, counties, [and] municipalities, and rural electric cooperatives which they are unable to perform because of extreme natural or man-made phenomena, and receiving reimbursement in whole or in part from such agencies, counties, [and] municipalities, and rural electric cooperatives able to pay therefor under such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon by the director of the state emergency management agency and any such agency, county, [or] municipality, or rural electric cooperative;
  - (4) Performing services for and furnishing materials to any individual in connection with alleviating hardship and distress growing out of extreme natural or man-made phenomena, and receiving reimbursement in whole or in part from such individual under such terms as may be agreed upon

- 92 by the director of the state emergency management agency and 93 such individual;
- 94 (5) Providing services to counties and municipalities 95 with respect to quelling riots and civil disturbances;
  - (6) Repairing and restoring public infrastructure;
- 97 (7) Furnishing transportation for supplies to 98 alleviate suffering and distress;

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- 99 (8) Furnishing medical services and supplies to 100 prevent the spread of disease and epidemics;
- 101 (9) Quelling riots and civil disturbances;
- 102 (10) Training individuals or governmental agencies for 103 the purpose of perfecting the performance of emergency 104 assistance duties as defined in the state disaster plans;
- 105 (11) Procurement, storage, and transport of special
  106 emergency supplies or equipment determined by the director
  107 to be necessary to provide rapid response by state
  108 government to assist counties and municipalities in
  109 impending or actual emergencies;
- 110 (12) Clearing or removing from publicly or privately
  111 owned land or water, debris and wreckage which may threaten
  112 public health or safety;
- 113 (13) Reimbursement to any urban search and rescue task 114 force for any reasonable and necessary expenditures incurred 115 in the course of responding to any declared emergency under 116 this section; and
- 117 (14) Such other measures as are customarily necessary
  118 to furnish adequate relief in cases of catastrophe or
  119 disaster.
- 120 6. The governor may receive such voluntary
  121 contributions as may be made from any source to aid in
  122 carrying out the purposes of this section and shall credit
  123 the same to the Missouri disaster fund.

- 124 7. All obligations and expenses incurred by the 125 governor in the exercise of the powers and duties vested by 126 the provisions of this section shall be paid by the state treasurer out of available funds in the Missouri disaster 127 fund, and the commissioner of administration shall draw 128 129 warrants upon the state treasurer for the payment of such sum, or so much thereof as may be required, upon receipt of 130 131 proper vouchers provided by the director of the state 132 emergency management agency.
- 133 The provisions of this section shall be liberally construed in order to accomplish the purposes of sections 134 44.010 to 44.130 and to permit the governor to cope 135 adequately with any emergency which may arise, and the 136 137 powers vested in the governor by this section shall be construed as being in addition to all other powers presently 138 139 vested in the governor and not in derogation of any existing 140 powers.
- 9. Such funds as may be made available by the government of the United States for the purpose of alleviating distress from disasters may be accepted by the state treasurer and shall be credited to the Missouri disaster fund, unless otherwise specifically provided in the act of Congress making such funds available.
- 10. The foregoing provisions of this section

  notwithstanding, any expenditure or proposed series of

  expenditures which total in excess of one thousand dollars

  per project shall be approved by the governor prior to the

  expenditure."; and
